## PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Van Maanen Electric was contracted to complete work on the new Des Moines Municipal Services Center II in Des Moines, Iowa. This project is the new location for Public Works, Fleet Services, Solid Waste Department and Radio Services. It includes office section, auto parts center, fleet building that has room for 80 public works vehicles, maintenance service center with 31 working stalls, a weld shop and lifts and cranes, fuel station, car wash and two-way communication radio shop. We incorporated energy efficient systems to lower operational costs and allowed the city to seek a LEED gold certification as a "green" building. We installed 188,000 feet of EMT conduit and 96,000 feet of PVC underground. The building also gets about 25% of its energy demands from the solar we installed on the roof.





DATE COMPLETED November 2022 Innovation Refunds is a leading innovate company creating additional income for companies of any size through tax refunds and rebates. They are located in the Regency West Building #8 on R&R property in West Des Moines. Through a long and prosperous business relationship between Realty Technology Services (a division of R&R Realty) and Van Maanen Technology, VMT was brought in to provide cabling services as Innovation Refunds was taking office space on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of RW8. Once the project started during the 1st quarter of 2022, it expanded to take over the complete office space of the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. Within 2 months of completion, Innovation Refunds expanded on to the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of RW8. This meant VMT needed to remove an existing data center, remove all cabling and systems on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor for Innovation Refunds. As the projects progressed, additional cabling was added for door schedulers and TV Monitors. Overall, 13+ miles of cabling was installed between the 2 floors.

The overall project took over 8 months. The project was led by a multitude of Van Maanen Technology employees, mainly lead by Foreman Sabas Ramirez and Trevor Hempen. Sabas has led many projects for VMT and Trevor is the lead Service Tech for all of RTS Properties. Although these two gentlemen lead most of the project, we also had the assistance of other Foreman such as Travis Lemon, Joe Voshell, Jesse Henderson, Blake Lossner, Jordan Wickre, and Peter Swank. # SAFETY SPOTLIGHT

### Safety on the Road – Driving Safely Starts with You

Unlike other workplaces, the roadway is not a closed environmet. Preventing work-related roadway accidents requires strategies that combine traffic safety principles and sound safety practices. Here are some work vehicle safety tips that every driver should follow:

- 1. **Check your blind spots**: Check mirrors every 8-10 seconds to be aware of vehicles entering your blind spots. Scan ahead for changing traffic patterns.
- 2. **Be aware of long stopping distances and drive at a safe speed**: Driving too fast for weather or road conditions or failing to slow down for curves or ramps create risks for crashes. Be aware of your surroundings, and never drive above the speed limit. Slow down, maintain extra following space, be prepared to stop.
- 3. Always buckle up: Wear your seat belt every time you drive or ride. Seat belts can save lives and reduce injuries.
- 4. Stay focused and avoid distracted driving: Get enough rest; don't drive when you're fatigued, feeling ill, or using medications (including over-the-counter medicine) that make you drowsy or dizzy. Texting is among the worst driving distractions. It is also illegal to drive and text. Eating, drinking, or any other activity that takes the focus off of the road can also be distracting.
- 5. Always use your signal: Signal and brake early to give other drivers plenty of time to notice your intent. If you must pull off the road, use flashers, reflective triangles, or other devices to alert approaching drivers.
- 6. **Maintain your vehicle**: Make sure pre-trip safety inspections are complete before hitting the road, particularly for tires and brakes. If you are hauling, make sure that your load is well-balanced and secure, as a shifting load can cause a rollover or loss of control. Loose materials can create road hazards.
- 7. **Plan your trip in advance**: Stay up-to-date on weather and road conditions, detours, and unfamiliar routes to plan appropriate driving time. This also keeps you from being distracted by navigation changes.
