



There is no finish line when it comes to public safety...all you can do is try and make things better. The Southern View Police are here to protect and serve but your help is needed as well!



Together we can have a positive impact on sound policing strategies and providing a secure environment for all to enjoy.


STOPPING FOR A SCHOOL BUS




TWO-LANE HIGHWAY

This should clear up some questions with how to respond to lights and stop arms.

If you are unaware, this is a BIG ticket. If found guilty of passing a bus stop arm when required to stop, your license **WILL BE** suspended. Officers know that when they write the ticket, but they also know the consequences of not writing the ticket could be much worse. Study the content below to keep school children, other traffic and yourself safe around .

"The driver is required to stop his or her vehicle before passing the school bus from either direction. An exception is when the driver is on a highway with four or more lanes with at least two lanes of traffic in either direction. If the driver is going in the opposite direction of the bus, they do not have to stop."

Reminds you to be aware of . . . **Suspicious Panhandler**

The Southern View Police Department has taken reports recently of a panhandler, black/male, near businesses along S. 6th St. The subject has stated he needs money because his vehicle has broken down. This is common for panhandlers as they attempt to play on your emotions and use stories such as this to gain money. Police Departments urge citizens not to give money to panhandlers as that may lead to further crimes, such as other valuables being taken. As always, you are urged to contact the police should you suspect suspicious activity.

Another one of Southern View's finest is Gabriel Gonzalez...

who also values the opportunity to serve.

Gabriel Gonzalez...is a son, husband, Father, Marine, and your Southern View Patrol Officer.

As a Marine he served a total of 11 ½ years... two of them in combat in Iraq and two years combat in Afghanistan. Then continued to protect and serve six years in law enforcement, with this last year at Southern View Police Department.

IRS Scam

The Southern View Police Department would like to remind the residents of the following potential scam: Residents have reported receiving calls from the IRS that agents will be coming to their home to arrest them due to a lack of payments.

Information from the IRS is as follows...

Note that the IRS does not:

- * Demand that you use a specific payment method, such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. The IRS will not ask for your debit or credit card numbers over the phone.
- * Demand that you pay taxes without the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe. Generally, the IRS will first mail you a bill if you owe any taxes. You should also be advised of your rights as a taxpayer.
- * Threaten to bring in local police, immigration officers or other law-enforcement to have you arrested for not paying.
- * The IRS also cannot revoke your driver's license, business licenses, or immigration status.

Threats like these are common tactics scam artists use to trick victims into buying into their schemes.

LIMB PICK-UP PROGRAM

Pick up for limbs begins the first Monday of every month, April through October. We ask that you

NOT put limbs out at the curb until the weekend before pickup.

The Village Public Works Crew will pick up the following:

- a) Limbs or branches that have fallen from trees and bushes.
- b) Only limbs or branches that have been trimmed from trees and bushes as it pertains to normal tree maintenance (see restrictions below).
- c) Limbs or branches less than 6' long and 4" in diameter, and cut into a manageable size.

NOTE: Items should be placed at the edge of your front yard, with nothing in the ditch.

RESTRICTIONS-- Limbs, branches, logs or excessive trimming resulting from tree removal, and any limbs, branches or logs larger than 6' long and 4" in diameter.

Please contact your waste disposal company to arrange for the pick up of stumps, shrubs, flowers, vines, garden waste and grass clippings.


Burning of Yard Waste



- Landscape waste,,,,,grass, shrubbery, leaves, tree limbs only.
- Wednesday and Thursday of each week. And, the first and third Saturday of each month. From 7am until 7pm OR dusk, whichever is first.
- Winds must be less than **20 MPH**.
- You must remain with the fire at all times.
- Avoid smoke/smolder by keeping a flame burning.
- Avoid burning on holidays, as burning is **PROHIBIT** on July 4th, Halloween (Oct.31st), Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day.
- No person shall burn trash, rubbish, papers, garbage, general household waste, commercial waste, construction or demolition debris.
- Burning in containers, i.e. burn barrels is prohibited.
- Violations shall be punished by written warning and subsequent fines not less than \$250.00 nor more than \$500.00.

Sleeping Trick

There's a trick that supposedly helps make you fall asleep in under a minute. It's called the "4-7-8" exercise. Basically, you breathe in slowly through your nose for 4 seconds... then, hold your breath for 7 seconds...breath out through your mouth for 8 seconds...then repeat the process 3 more times! *Give it a try...*
