### LIMB REMOVAL

Limb pickup begins the first working Monday of every month, **April through October**. We ask that you **DO NOT** put limbs out at the curb until the weekend before pickup and never in your ditch. The Village Public Works Crew will pick up the following:

- Limbs or branches that have fallen from the trees and bushes
- Only limbs or branches that have been trimmed from trees and or bushes as it pertains to normal tree maintenance.
- · Limbs or branches must be less than 6 feet long and 4 inches in diameter.
- Restriction on the actual pile size is 6' x 4' x 4'
- We will not pick up whole trees that have been cut down
- · Limbs must be laid parallel with the street to allow our backhoe to pick them up

### **HOME SECURITY CAMERAS**

The Village of Southern View Police Department would like to know if your property has security cameras, examples include a ring doorbell, video surveillance system or other system like blink cameras on your property. The Police Department does not want access, nor will they share with anyone or entity if in fact you have cameras. This information will only be used by the Police Department in an event that is deemed necessary to capture individuals coming to or from a crime scene, maybe they may have caused damage or stolen property of your neighbors. It is another avenue the Police Department can help fight crime in our neighborhood. You can reach out to the Police Department directly at 217–529–0255 or by sending an email to rwiese@southernview.us. Remember they will not share that information with anyone, it is strictly for aiding the Police to solve crimes. Knowing where the cameras are allows them to save valuable time when working their case to arresting the criminals. If the footage you have could aid the States Attorney in prosecuting the offender, they may ask for a copy. If you see something suspicious always call 217-529-0255 and report it to a Southern View Officer. The Police Department hear all the time that residents don't want to bother them, PLEASE BOTHER US, WE WANT TO KNOW! You will not waste our time!

### **CONTEST**

The Village would love to start "living" again so what better way than to decorate for the holidays. Back again this year will be a decorating contest for Halloween and for Christmas! If you have the spirit within you let it show on your property!

Remember there is a Village Ordinance that requires you to put your pets on a leash when walking your pets off your premises. Whether you are walking down the street or walking your pet in the Village Park it is imperative that you have control of your animal. There are people that walk in our parks and roadways that are afraid of animals. Please be respectful and courteous to others. DO NOT let your dog roam free. DO NOT let your dog out unattended to relieve themselves in your neighbors' yard. The Village has received more complaints this year of dogs running loose and relieving themselves in residents flower gardens and even on roadways. Pick up your dog's droppings. This is your responsibility!! If not picked up, you could be faced with a fine up to \$750.00 by our Village of Southern View Police Department.

### **LEAVES**

The Village of Southern View has a fall leaf collection program, which allows residents to remove their leaves without using a bag and paying for a sticker on each bag. Rake your leaves to the edge of your yard, NOT IN THE DITCH, and then Public Works Crew will pick up and dispose of your leaves for free. The truck we use for this process has one huge hose to vacuum up the leaves. This hose is located on the right side of the vehicle and its design only allows it to be used for one side of the street at a time. When that one side is done and the truck is full, they must drive to the dump for disposal prior to any additional pickups. Please help by raking any other debris little twigs or limbs from your pile of leaves as only leaves can be vacuumed with this equipment. Again, these leaves should be placed at the end of your yard, NOT IN THE DITCH!

### **BURNING RULES**

Burning is allowed on Wednesday and Thursday of each week and the first and third Saturday of each month between the hours of 7 am and 7 pm or dusk whichever is first. The fire must be constantly attended until it is extinguished and have a garden hose readily available. Burning is not allowed if wind speed is 20 mph or more. Burning barrels are prohibited. No person shall burn trash, rubbish, papers, garbage, general household waste, commercial waste, construction, or demolition debris. No burning on the following holidays: New Years day, July 4th, Veterans Day, Halloween, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. Violations of this Ordinance can result in a fine of not less than \$250.00 or more than \$500.00.

### **MOSQUITOS**

The Southern View Public Works Dept would like to remind residents that you can help prevent the spread of mosquitos by a few simple preventive measures at home. The Public Works Dept has repaired the sprayer that we use throughout the Village for vector control to help eliminate the mosquito problem. This year, we have begun using a water based eco-friendly spray that does not put a huge fog into the air. This chemical is supposed to work more efficiently and is better for the environment as the previous chemical. There is a difference in the spray that comes out. Help us by ensuring that you have eliminated any breading grounds on your residence. The list below will help you determine what to look for on your property to stop the spread of these pesky insects.

- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery welltrimmed around the house
- Fill in any low places in the yard that puddles accumulate
- Dispose of any tires
- Drill holes in the bottom of recycling containers and garbage containers
- Clear roof gutters of debris
- Clean pet water dishes regularly
- Empty out children's toys that have water accumulated
- Repair leaky outdoor faucets

- Change the water in bird baths at least once a week
- Canoes and boars should be turned over
- Avoid water collecting on pool covers
- Empty water collected in tarps around the yard or on woodpiles
- Plug tree holes
- Don't allow water to collect in any containers.
   They can breed hundreds to thousands of mosquitoes (bottles, barrels, buckets, overturned garbage lids etc.)

### CHRISTMAS TREE REMOVAL

Hard to believe we are talking about Christmas in October, but the Public Works Crew will begin the Complimentary pick up and disposal of your Christmas Tree from December 27th to January 13th, 2023. The very last day the Public Works Crew will make only one trip on January 13, 2023 to pick up the remaining real trees, make sure you have yours out by 7 am on that day.

### SANGAMON ALERT MESSAGING SYSTEM (SAM)

Sangamon Alert Messaging System or SAM sends alerts to your mobile device or your landline via text message, phone call, or email if an emergency is happening in your neighborhood. Sign up to receive emergency alerts from your local Office of Emergency Management. Texting; SAM to 99411, will take to you directly to the SAM Community Notification Enrollment form.

### **Features & Benefits**

Sangamon Alert Messaging (SAM) will allow County officials to be able to more effectively communicate time-sensitive messages using the SAM's robust dialing infrastructure that is entirely managed by its parent company, OnSolve. This access will allow calls to be delivered seconds after public safety officials launch a message. Additionally, the County will have the ability to better target notifications geographically, only notifying those community members impacted by an alert.

Contact information accessed through Sangamon Alert Messaging (SAM) will only be used by Public Safety Officials for emergency notification purposes your information will not be shared or sold.

### VILLAGE REPORTS

The Village has gone through some changes during the last several years. As with many of you, the Village has had some good and bad times. We are happy to report that the Village is resuming all the activities that we have had in the past. Covid was not something any of us had thought of and it did take its toll on us all. We have had some personnel changes in Public Works and the Police Department. It is always an adjustment when knowledgeable employees leave but we believe we are going to see great things with the current employees we have working for the Village. Our only request for our residents is please be patient, they are learning their new roles and that does take time. We are very excited to see what the future holds. During the last few years, the Village Board has strived to complete items that they felt needed to be accomplished for the Village and their employees, updating the Employee Manual, revisiting the needs for each department, streamlining the spending and being accountable to the residents of the Village.

The Village has enrolled in the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund for their employees, this pension program will hopefully encourage employees to stay with our Village and eventually retire from here with a pension. The Village has saved thousands of dollars by switching the health insurance for the employees, the liability insurance, removing maintenance contracts that were unnecessary, created agreements with various vendors that allows for discounted purchasing and streamlined the spending (of course Covid helped with this by not having any events).

### Here is a short list of each department:

### POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Remodeled the inside of the Police Department
- Added siding and gutters on the Police Department
- Ordered new signage on the Police Department
- Replaced the HVAC unit in the Police Department
- Itemized all evidence in the Evidence Locker
- Updated the computer systems in the office and cars
- Purchased new car cameras and body cameras that are worn by all officers while on duty
- Updated the radios to allow constant contact with Dispatch
- Cleaned up and removed all abandoned vehicles in the tow lot

### **PUBLIC WORKS**

- Public Works has been working on the drainage issues within Southern View by digging out ditches to help the water flow
- Upgraded the backhoe
- Performed mechanical maintenance on all vehicles
- Purchased a utility vehicle that can be used in the Park and the Municipal complex
- Cleaned up the back lot and are installing bays for dirt and rock
- Obtaining bids to replace the salt storage bin
- Upgrading the street signs with the proper retroflectivity signage required

### ADMINISTRATION

- Upgraded the locks to a master key system
- Installed a bulletin board for displaying information to residents
- Installed fiber optic cables to network all three buildings together
- Installed a new phone system that allows calls to be transferred
- Raised the rental rates for non resident which has allowed residents to access the hall easier

### **PARK**

- Purchased 2 riding lawn mowers to maintain the park
- Installed metal roofs on the East bathroom and the West Pavilion
- Purchased a new fountain and bubblers for the pond
- Added 3 new picnic tables around the playground for families to enjoy
- Upgraded 6 new benches throughout the park
- Upgraded the fence covers on the two fields
- Purchased new bases for the fields
- Purchased a self leveling drag for the fields
- Purchased two sets of bleachers to add to the soccer field
- Cleaned and sealed the Park path and hockey and basketball court
- Installed drain pipes around the East side of the park to help with the drainage
