CENSUS

The 2020 Census is coming to a close on September 30th. Have you reported your address to the US Census? If not, you may be visited by the enumerators coming to your door. It is *imperative* that all residents complete the census. Many of the Village revenue funding received are based on the population or census and we need everyone to be counted, as these figures stay with the Village for the next 10 years. At least \$1,400 per man woman and child per year is at risk, which means it's about \$15,000 – \$20,000 for every person over the next ten years. Please do your part and register your address in the Village. Currently we are at 75% of the village that has responded and been counted, and an estimate of 400 people have not returned the census as of the 2010 census. Residents can complete the census online at *www.my2020census.gov*, by phone at 844–330–2020, or by returning the census that was mailed to you, and lastly by speaking with the enumerators that come to your residence.

SNOW

A friendly reminder when there is more than 2 inches of snow predicted, we want to remind residents to move their vehicles off the street. It is a hazard for our Public Works Department to clear the street and spread salt on our roadways if there are vehicles they must avoid. If there is 2 inches or more that has fallen and a vehicle is on the street, it will be towed and you will be responsible for the tow fee. Please be courteous. The Village Public Works Department is responsible for clearing the streets and salting them to allow drivers access outside of the Village.

BOARD MEETINGS

Unfortunately, with the state of Covid-19 the Village of Southern View Board decided to limit the number of Board meetings to one meeting per month. This meeting will be on the fourth Tuesday of each month. For the last few months, the Village Board has met in the Southern View Park at the Martin Pavilion to conduct these meetings and to allow residents to attend with six-foot social distancing. This has worked out quite well and we have enjoyed good weather during these meetings. This will have to come to an end as cooler and possibly wetter weather will be here before we know it. The Village will be doing the Board Meetings via Zoom. There will be a linkonthe Village of Southern View's webpage at villageofsouthernview.us that will take you into the Zoom meeting. DRAINAGE

Have you noticed flags of different colors in front of your home? If so, JULIE has been called to mark underground utilities. Do not remove the flags. You may have noticed that the Public Works Department has been very busy working on the drainage issues in the Village. Public Works have unclogged the main drains going out of the Village, and throughout the Summer and into the Fall they are digging out ditches that have filled up over the years and have also replaced various culverts to help the drainage. Of course, they have hit the problem areas first, but rest assure this is a project that takes time to complete. Some ditches may not need that much attention, but they are very few in the scope of this project. As of August 31st, 2020 Public Works have dug out over 3,508 feet of ditches and they are not done. They have also completed replacing nearly 100 feet of culverts. Great job Joe, Cody and Dave! Residents will see a difference when the rains come, and the water is traveling out of the Village. Please be patient. Hopefully by next fall we will have this project complete. We ask that you keep your ditches always clean of debris, as this helps the water travel. DO NOT burn, pile leaves, pile sticks or limbs, or garbage in the ditch.

DID YOU KNOW??

BURNING RULES LIMB REMOVAL

Limb pickup begins the first Monday of every month starting in April and goes to October. We ask that you DO NOT put limbs out at the curb until the weekend before pickup and never in your ditch.

The Village Public Works Crew will pick up the following:

- Limbs or branches that have fallen from the trees and bushes
- Only limbs or branches that have been trimmed from trees and or bushes as it pertains to normal tree maintenance.
- Limbs or branches must be less than 6 feet long and 4 inches in diameter.
- Restriction on the actual pile size is 6'x 4'x 4'
- We will not pick up whole trees that have been cut down

LEAVES

The Village of Southern View has a fall leaf collection program, which allows residents to remove their leaves without paying the usual \$1.50 per sticker on each bag. Rake your leaves to the edge of your yard, **NOT IN THE DITCH**, and then Public Works Crew will pick up and dispose of your leaves for free. The truck we use for this process has one huge hose to vacuum up the leaves. This hose is located on the right side of the vehicle and its design only allows it to be used for one side of the street at a time. When that one side is done and the truck is full, they must drive to the dump for disposal prior to any additional pickups. Please help by raking any other debris little twigs or limbs from your pile of leaves as only leaves can be vacuumed with this equipment. Again, these leaves should be placed at the end of your yard, **NOT IN THE DITCH!**

Remember there is a Village Ordinance that requires you to put your pets on a leash when walking your pets off your premises. Whether you are walking down the street or walking your pet in the Village Park it is imperative that you have control of your animal. There are people that walk in our parks and roadways that are afraid of animals. Please be respectful and courteous to others.

DO NOT let your dog out unattended to relieve themselves in your neighbors' yard. Pick up your dog's droppings. This is your responsibility!! If not picked up, you could be faced with a fine by our Village of Southern View Police Department.

MOSOUITOS

The Southern View Public Works Dept would like to remind residents that you can help prevent the spread of mosquitos by a few simple preventive measures at home. The Public Works Dept has repaired the sprayer that we use throughout the Village for vector control to help eliminate the mosquito problem. This year, we have begun using a water based eco-friendly spray that does not put a huge fog into the air. This chemical is supposed to work more efficiently and is better for the environment as the previous chemical. There is a difference in the spray that comes out. Help us by ensuring that you have eliminated any breading grounds on your residence. The list below will help you determine what to look for on your property to stop the spread of these pesky insects.

- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery well-trimmed around the house
- Fill in any low places in the yard that puddles accumulate
- Dispose of any tires
- Drill holes in the bottom of recycling containers and garbage containers
- Clear roof gutters of debris
- Clean pet water dishes regularly
- Empty out children's toys that have water accumulated

- Repair leaky outdoor faucets
- Change the water in bird baths at least once a week
- Canoes and boars should be turned over
- Avoid water collecting on pool covers
- Empty water collected in tarps around the yard or on woodpiles
- Plug tree holes
- Don't allow water to collect in any containers. They can breed hundreds to thousands of mosquitoes (bottles, barrels, buckets, overturned garbage lids etc.)

FALL PICK UP

Unfortunately, we will not be doing a fall pick up this year. This has been a big topic around the Village and the Village Board. The Village had investigated having a waste hauler come through the Village but unfortunately, most of the items the residents throw out for the pickup would not be accepted and the costs for this was \$8,000. The Village considered having a large dumpster at the Village hall for you to bring your unwanted items here but we were told that wouldn't be a good idea either due to having a large group of residents together at one time. In fact, Flowers Disposal who most Villages and small towns contract with refused to provide a dumpster to any event due to the pandemic. Covid-19 is not something we wanted to deal with that is for sure and it has affected so many things in our lives this year. This may not be a popular decision, but it is the best decision for the Village. The Village Boards main concern is keeping the residents and our employees safe. The Village has reached out to many other communities that offer junk pick up and each one has cancelled their events because of Covid-19 (Woodside Township, Jerome, Virden, and Chatham) due to safety concerns for their employees.
