Why TQRE & Why Now?

The social services sector faces significant strain due to stretched budgets and overloaded crisis response systems, impacting vulnerable communities. TQRE aims to change this by emphasizing proactive, data-driven prevention rather than reactive intervention, leading to reduced costs, improved service effectiveness, and lasting social impact. Early Intervention & Family Stability

- Identifies risk before crisis occurs, ensuring that at-risk children and families receive the right support before removals, justice system involvement, or homelessness.
- Enables holistic, wraparound family services that strengthen households, reducing the need for government intervention.

Transforming Social Service Funding & Accountability

- Shifts funding from crisis response to prevention, ensuring that resources are allocated where they create the most long-term impact.
- Holds service providers accountable, ensuring public funding is directed toward outcomes-driven programs instead of inefficiencies.

Cross-Sector Collaboration & Secure Data Integration

- Eliminates service silos by enabling real-time, secure, and ethical data sharing across child protection, health, education, justice, and community services.
- Ensures frontline professionals have a full-picture understanding of vulnerabilities, allowing for faster and more effective interventions.

Improving Government Responsiveness & Policy Planning

- Empowers policymakers with real-time data on emerging risks, allowing for dynamic budget allocation and resource deployment before crises escalate.
- Enables targeted workforce planning, ensuring critical service gaps, such as mental health, AOD response, and youth justice are addressed before shortages occur.

Culturally Safe & Community-Led Solutions

- Prioritizes kinship-based care and Indigenous-led solutions, ensuring vulnerable individuals remain connected to their identity, family, and culture.
- Creates locally driven intervention strategies, reducing the risk of government-imposed models that don't reflect community needs.



The Cost of Inaction – Where We Are Now

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We are spending record budgets, but outcomes are worsening. The longer we delay structural reform, the greater the cost, not just in dollars, but in lives, trust, and national stability. Right now, Families are breaking down. Communities are burning out and the systems meant to protect them are stuck in reaction mode. TQRE - Ethical. Scalable. Measurable. Ready. Let's not review this crisis again in five years. Let's end it — and build what's next.

THE PRICE OF REACTION: WHAT THE SYSTEM COSTS US DAILY

1 Key System Failures & Financial Strain

- NSW child protection system receives over 100,000 ROSH - Risk of Significant Harm reports annually
- Only 26% result in an actual home visit (*AIHW, 2023*)
- 250+ daily ROSH reports, with many delayed due to staffing shortages and thresholds
- OOHC (Out-of-Home Care) costs the government up to \$600,000+ per child, per year in high-needs cases
- Reactive crisis-based casework can cost up to 5x more than early intervention over a child's lifetime
- Youth justice system costs \$1,650 per young person per day in detention (*Productivity Commission, 2023*)
- Youth recidivism remains over 65% within 12 months post-release in NSW
- Escalated police and ambulance callouts to OOHC homes for violence, AOD use, self-harm
- Many residential staff report 3+ critical incidents per week per home, driving police burnout and distrust
- Aboriginal children are still 10 times more likely to be removed from family than non-Indigenous children (*Family Matters Report, 2022*)
- Over 30% of children in care will experience 3+ placements, increasing trauma and system disengagement

2 What We Have Seen To Work.

- Youth on Track: Reduced reoffending by up to 50%
- Intensive family support models: 70%+ of children remain safely at home
- Ethical AI pilots: Improve early detection by 30–50%
- Community-led healing programs: Increase family engagement, reduce breakdowns

— These programs are effective — but funded at a fraction of crisis services

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Why TQRE & Why Now?

A REFORM ACROSS EVERY DOMAIN

1

Micro: Compassionate, Individualised Decision-Making

- Risk is assessed in real-time, allowing for nuanced, person-centred support
- Cultural, protective, and contextual data are embedded—not added on
- TQRE tracks outcomes for every family, ensuring support is effective, not just provided

Macro: System-Wide Governance Reform

- Overhauls funding models to prioritise prevention, not patchwork
- Connects health, education, justice, and child protection systems into one ethical infrastructure
- Eliminates duplication, improves workforce efficiency, and streamlines reporting

Technological: Ethical AI for Human-Centred Risk Management

- Predictive modelling identifies community stress and trends-early
- Dormant tracking prevents overreach but activates when risk emerges
- Workers receive decision support, not replacement, via tech scaffolding

Political: A Roadmap That Honors All Values

- Balances fiscal responsibility with human dignity
