

Blaine Siglin's WWII Record

After the January 2018 Redball meeting adjourned, President Jim Siglin presented a talk about his Father Blaine's record in WWII. Jim's Grandmother saved all the WWII papers from Blaine.



Blaine was drafted into the Army, 17 April 1942 in Stroudsburg, PA and was sent to Camp Polk, Louisiana and then to Ibis, California for training. Blaine was sent to the ETO, 29 September 1944 where he was in combat for 4 months and ten days. He was discharged 29 December 1945 at Indiantown Gap, PA



Above is a "fun" newspaper headline that the troops could have made. Even though they were preparing to go overseas, you could tell what was on their mind.

Blaine was assigned to Troop A, 41st Calvary Reconnaissance (Mechanized), 11th Armored Division which was activated 15 August 1942 at Camp Polk, Louisiana.

It was part of Patton's Third Army and had 3 Campaign Stars for Ardennes, Rhineland, Central Europe.

Troop A was the first 3rd Army unit to link up with the Russians at Amstettin, Austria, 08 May 1945 and became the Eastern most of Allied Forces on the Western Front, V-E Day, 09 May 1945 as the war ended.

Blaine's Decorations/Commendations: Bronze Star (one of only 2 awarded in Div., Good Conduct Medal, Letter of Commendation for Russian Link-up from Gen. H.E. Dager, Commanding General, 11th Armored Div., Belgium Medals 2, Chevalier of the Order of Leopold II with Palms, Croix de Guere 1940 with Palms.


