Stewardship is an expression of our practical faith. It is not just about how we spend our money, but about how we spend our lives. We are called to spend our lives in service to others.

**Deacon Pat Harris** will lead a “Bible-Background Class” (BBC) at **St Michael the Archangel in Fairfield** on Wednesdays from 7:30 to 9:00p (right after the Wed 7PM Mass or Communion Service) **AND** a “Bible-Related Study” (BRS) at **All Saints** in Taylorsville on Mondays from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. These are separate programs with different topics. The BRS (Taylorsville) starts on Monday Oct 22 and the BBC (Fairfield) starts on Wednesday Oct 24. There is no Registration and no Fee for either program; both are open to all (Catholic and non-Catholic) persons (ages 15 to 115). Each session in both programs is stand-alone; a person does not have to attend previous sessions to benefit from the next session. Classes include DVD (or handouts) and discussion; homework is not required. Please try both our BBC and BRS, and come as often as you can.



**Catechism Corner: *Devotion to the Blessed Virgin***



“All generations will call me blessed”: “The Church’s devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship. The Church rightly honors “the Blessed Virgin with special devotion. From the most ancient times, the Blessed Virgin has been honored with the title of ‘Mother of God,’ to whose protection the faithful fly in all their dangers and needs...This very special devotion...differs essentially from the adoration which is given to the incarnate Word and equally to the Father and the Holy Spirit, and greatly fosters this adoration.” The liturgical feasts dedicated to the Mother of God and Marian prayer,

such as the rosary, an “epitome of the whole Gospel,” express this devotion to the Virgin Mary. (CCC 971)

The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son’s Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body. (CCC 974)
