We were able to have our General Meeting in June. This was our first meeting since February and it certainly had a different look than normal. I would like to thank those who showed up for adhering to the social distancing that was set up and for wearing masks. This will probably be the norm for the next few months since it looks like the number of positive cases are on the rise in both Linn and Johnson counties. It was announced that RENEW will also be resuming their meetings starting with the first Thursday in July. I am currently looking for a location to have an Iowa City Unit Meeting in July. The parks are open, but the pavilions are on a first-come, first-served basis at this time, so we would not be able to guarantee a site. The Iowa City office is a limited space, but we could manage a meeting there with social distancing, depending on the number of attendees. I will post on our website and Facebook once a location has been determined.

Nominations have closed and once the Judge verifies all candidates eligibility and willingness to serve for the office to which they were nominated, ballots will be printed and sent out. You should receive your ballot by July 15th. If you have not received it by then, call the Hall and we will let the Judge know so that we can verify the address and if necessary he can mail a replacement ballot. Your ballot will come in an envelope that says "Election Materials Enclosed". Please take a few minutes and participate in the election of your Local 405 Officers.

In an effort to track the affect that the COVID-19 Virus has had on the Local and the IBEW as a whole, I am asking that if you have been diagnosed as a positive for COVID-19, please contact the Hall and let me know. I know there are a number of members who have had the symptoms, but were not able to be tested, but the tracking is only for those who were able to test.

The Iowa Legislature went back into session for two weeks following an extended shutdown due to COVID-19. The Republicans wasted no time in moving their anti-worker agenda. Their first order of business was to pass a bill that protects factories and employers from being held responsible if their employees are exposed to COVID-19. It makes it nearly impossible to hold them responsible for exposures and definitely does not incentivize them to take precautions to protect their employees. They followed this up with an attack on professional licenses in Iowa. The Iowa, IBEW Conference was able to join other groups and have the worst of this legislation removed, but what passed is an insult to anyone who has been through an apprenticeship. In the remaining days, along party-line votes, the Republican-controlled chambers made it harder for the County Auditors to send out Absentee Ballot Requests. This legislation was opposed by every County Auditor in Iowa, regardless of their political affiliation, but was passed anyway with only to R's in the Senate joining with all Democrats in opposing the bill. The legislature also failed to move forward on restoring voting rights to felons who have fulfilled their sentences. This was a stated priority of the Governor, but the Republicans did not address it.
