BUSINESS MANAGER REPORT

Brothers and Sisters,

On September 6th, the Linn County Supervisors approved the Duane Arnold Solar Project with a vote of 2-1. This comes after several months of our members lobbying and attending board meetings to speak in favor of this project and the jobs it is going to create for the members of IBEW Local 405. Thank you to all the members that were able to dedicate some of their personal time to assist with getting this across the finish line. This particular project is going to spur economic development in Linn County for years to come and is going to continue to put our members to work on new projects in this area. Great Job!

Negotiations for the Cedar Rapids Inside Agreement and the Statewide VDV Agreement will be going on during the month of October. There is a contract survey on the Calls page of our website that we encourage everyone to fill out to give us feedback as we head into negotiations. Both of these contracts will have to be ratified before the end of October; the notification for these ratification meetings will be posted on the website.

In lieu of a Children's Christmas Party, this year we have decided to host an event at Bloomsbury Farm for our members and their children/grandchildren. During the pandemic, we were forced to cancel the party for the last two years. Choosing this outdoor alternative assures us that if there is an uptick in Covid cases, we can continue with our plans without canceling the event. We look forward to seeing everyone there.

Local 405 will be participating in two parades in October, the Dark Harvest Halloween Parade in the Czech Village/NewBo area and the University of Iowa Homecoming Parade. As we get closer to the events, we will be posting information on the website for those who want to participate or volunteer.

The month of October is going to be a busy one for the upcoming election. There are many candidates that support our labor issues that are going to need help this month in the form of phone banking, door knocking, and literature drops. Hawkeye Area Labor Council has walk packets available at our Hall for anyone that can dedicate a little time to help the cause. As we get closer to the election, we will keep a list on the website of the candidates that are endorsed and supported by Labor. CONTRACT TOPIC OF THE MONTH

CR INSIDE

<u>Section 3.17.</u> Material delivery shall be made by the Employer, Employer's Representative, or workmen employed under the terms of this Agreement. Workmen shall not be required or permitted to haul Employer's materials or tools in their own vehicles.

The Employer's representative, if not an apprentice electrician or a journeyman electrician, shall not perform electrical work.

An employee shall be paid \$1.00 per trip for moving his own tools during the working day in his own car, if he so desires.

IC INSIDE

<u>Section 3.19.</u> Material delivery shall be made by the Employer, Employer's representative, or workmen employed under the terms of this Agreement.

Workmen shall not be required or permitted to haul Employer's materials or tools in their own vehicles.

The Employer's representative, if not an apprentice electrician or journeyman electrician, shall not perform electrical work.

RESIDENTIAL

<u>Section 3.24.</u> Material delivery shall be made by the Employer, Employer's representative, or workmen employed under the terms of this Agreement. Workmen shall not be required or permitted to haul Employer's materials or tools in their own vehicle.

The Employer's representative, if not a Residential Trainee or Residential Wireman, shall not perform electrical work.

An employee shall be paid \$1.00 per trip for moving his own tools during the working day in his own car, if he so desires.

<u>Section 3.11 (b).</u> Travel Time and Mileage: Workmen shall not be required as a condition of employment to furnish the use of an automobile or other conveyance to transport men, tools, equipment or material. All facilities for such transportation shall be provided by the employer.
