As we witness the resurgence of COVID cases in Iowa and across the country, conversations are being had about mandatory vaccines. As of now it has been announced that Unity Point and MercyOne are going to require their employees to get the vaccine. With the recent full FDA approval of the Pfizer vaccine, it is being said that more employers are considering vaccine mandates for employers.

For our members who work on these sites, the vaccine would be required of them. These types of customer requirements are nothing new to us, our customers have always held us to their site requirements to work at their facilities. We have had to pass background checks, take drug tests and get Hepatitis vaccines to work at different facilities. Everyone has the right to decide on their own if they want the vaccine or not. If you choose not to get the vaccine, there will be places that you will be unable to work. The hope would be that your employer would be able to send you to a jobsite that does not require it. This may not always be the option available and could result in a layoff.



Cedar Rapids & Iowa City Inside, Residential & VDV Agreements


This is the section of the contracts that outlines our obligations to adhere to our employers' policies as well as our customers rules and regulations.

<u>Section 2.02.</u> The Union understands the Employer is responsible to perform the work required by the owner. The Employer shall, therefore, have no restrictions except those specifically provided for in the collective bargaining agreement, in planning, directing and controlling the operation of all his work, in deciding the number and kind of employees to properly perform the work, in hiring and laying off employees, in transferring employees from job to job within the Local Union's geographical jurisdiction, in determining the need and number as well as the person who will act as Foreman, in requiring all employees to observe the Employer's and /or owners' rules and regulations not inconsistent with this Agreement, in requiring all employees to observe all safety regulations, and in discharging employees for proper cause.

RETIREES SOCIAL CLUB



Benefits of Getting a COVID-19 Vaccine

Updated Aug. 16, 2021

COVID-19 vaccines are safe

- COVID-19 vaccines were developed using science that has been around for decades.
- COVID-19 vaccines are not experimental. They went through all the required stages of clinical trials. Extensive testing and monitoring have shown that these vaccines are safe and effective.
- COVID-19 vaccines have received and continue to undergo the most intensive safety monitoring in U.S. history.

COVID-19 vaccines are effective

- COVID-19 vaccines are effective. They can keep you from getting and spreading the virus that causes COVID-19.
- COVID-19 vaccines also help keep you from getting seriously ill even if you do get COVID-19.
- Getting vaccinated yourself may also protect people around you, particularly people at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19.

Delta Variant

The Delta Variant causes more infections and spreads faster than earlier forms of the virus that causes COVID-19. It might cause more severe illness than previous strains in unvaccinated people.

- Vaccines continue to reduce a person's risk of contracting the virus that causes COVID-19, including this variant.
- Vaccines continue to be highly effective at preventing hospitalization and death, including against this variant
- Fully vaccinated people with breakthrough infections from this variant appear to be infectious for a shorter period.

Get vaccinated and wear masks indoors in public spaces to reduce the spread of this variant.
