The Reality

Young people are growing up in a rapidly developing digital world – one that often moves faster than policy, education and parenting can adapt. Relationships and behavioural norms, for many, are being shaped by online influences such as pornography and extreme misogynistic or misandristic messaging. This is leading to problematic sexualised behaviour, violence against women and girls, and cultures that do not foster respectful relationships.

In 2023-24, **7,748 children** in years 9-13 told us:

MORE THAN
1 in 3 witness sexual comments, remarks or jokes in school at least weekly

ONLY
36% would feel confident telling their school if they experienced sexual harassment

32% of children have seen porn.

Average age of first viewing porn is **12 years old**

29% of repeat porn users have acted out porn

48% of children think more should be done to prevent them from viewing porn.

Why This Matters for Schools

In 2025, safeguarding became a stand-alone judgement in Ofsted inspections. Inspectors now look closely at how schools address sexual harassment, harmful behaviours and relationships education, with increasing focus on evidence of real impact on pupils' safety, confidence and wellbeing.

In 2026, the DFE revised their Guidance on RSE to strengthen education around sexual harassment and online harms. This includes topics such as naked image sharing, deepfakes, strangulation, pornography, misogyny and consent.

One YMCA's Dignify Programme is designed to support schools meet these needs and expectations. With the right insight, language and support, schools are uniquely positioned to shape culture and help children develop in healthy relationships.

The Dignify School Survey: Overview

The Dignify School Survey is a digital survey for use primarily with Years 9 to 13 (although we can adapt it for Years 7 and 8).

Our Survey:

- Is anonymous
- Covers topics including: social media use, nude sharing, exposure to porn, harmful sexual behaviour in school, children's thoughts on RSE provisions and overall wellbeing
- Offers tailored recommendations based on data outcomes
- Provides schools and colleges with a comprehensive audit that supports Ofsted's 2021 recommendations for whole-school and whole-community approaches, in addition to their 2025 focus on safeguarding
- Is updated to include questions on the Online Safety Act, giving you the most up-to-date insights into the way that legislation is impacting students

What Does the Dignify School Survey Include?

- An individual hashed school survey link to be distributed to students
- A student information letter
- A briefing for teachers
- A template letter for parents

We then conduct a full analysis of the survey data, including gender and year group breakdowns where appropriate. Your school will be provided with:

- **A full report** and executive summary of findings
- **Recommendations** for any potential changes to your school or colleges RSE programme
- **A safeguarding document** for key staff

School Case Study: Our Impact

Schools that have partnered with us for consecutive years, and have done repeated surveys, are finding evidenced improvements in their schools culture, and their students' experiences.

CASE STUDY:

Between Spring 2022 and Spring 2025, this school partner saw:

6% decrease in the number of students who have personally experienced sexual comments, remarks or jokes in school

8% decrease in the number of students who have been sent messages with sexual wording

We have worked with this school to provide teaching on sexual harassment, bodily autonomy, informed consent, self-worth and other topics that have contributed to positive data trends in this area.

8% decrease in the number of students who have sent a nude

15% decrease in the number of students who have received a nude

We have delivered sessions on nude-sharing, helping students from Year 7 onwards to know the law around nude-sharing, and the importance of self-worth. We also cover risks such as emotional harm, blackmail, and how pornography normalises nude-sharing.

12% decrease in the number of students who report having a porn habit

Dignify Ambassador Programme

The Dignify Ambassador Programme is a new initiative that equips a selected group of students with **expert-led training on healthy relationships**, consent, respect, and digital culture – directly supporting your RSE curriculum and strengthening evidence for Ofsted’s key frameworks. Across two focused days, Ambassadors will:

- **Develop confidence and leadership**
receiving workshops on public speaking, advocacy and peer influence
- **Shape your school culture**
working together to create a student-led Charter grounded in respect, consent and empowerment
- **Drive whole-school impact**
delivering assemblies and helping embed the Charter across year groups



Staff Training

Foundation: The Dignify School Survey provides you with insights into the needs of your students, helping steer focussed intervention.

Level 1:

A 90-minute workshop to equip staff with an evidence-based understanding on how to navigate conversations with young people on sexual harassment, pornography and other specialist areas. This will empower you to build a more inclusive culture and be proactive in preventing problematic sexual behaviour.

Level 2:

A whole-day in-person training, supported by additional online top-up sessions, designed to train your staff to deliver our Whole-School Lesson Pack with confidence.

Our Lesson Pack provides structured age-appropriate lessons for Years 7 to 13, supporting a consistent and progressive approach to RSE in line with the latest guidance and rooted in research.

The lessons are organised around three core themes:

- Championing healthy relationships
- Understanding the harms of pornography
- Challenging harmful social norms and sexual objectification.

Gain critical insight to strengthen your strategy for tackling sexual harassment, improve RSE provision, and build a safe, respectful culture.

Parent Workshops (see parents.dignify.org)
