LANDSCAPE COMMITTEE

Our property suffered some damage from hurricane Irma. We lost four sable palms and one coconut palm, five hibiscus, four Ti plants and two bougainvillea. Between cleanup and replacement plant material \$1670 will have been spent.

Most of our plant material is showing signs of wind and salt burn. We have done a cut back on most plants and they have been fertilized so we need to wait and see what will recover before I do anymore remove and replace.

I know the hybrid crown of thorns inside the gate by the guardhouse look pretty bad now, but I'm hopeful.

On a walk-a-round I noticed our hibiscus in front of the west wall was not flowering. Upon further inspection I saw they had "bud drop" and mealy bugs. I notified Royal Green and they were out the next day to treat them. The hibiscus are starting to keep their blooms and flower now.

Our palm trees have been trimmed and the property has been mulched. With all the rain we had during the tropical storms and Irma many of the growers plant material rotted out. Our choices for plantings at the front entrance were "what color of begonias would we like". That's why we have begonias and not geraniums.

I feel overall our property and palms look pretty good compared to some of our neighbors. Any questions you have, feel free to contact me.
