Hello Empress Family,

The Holiday Season is upon us! Where has the time gone?

As usual, much work is going on to keep your homestead maintained and beautiful. The following list summarizes those efforts.

The new Lobby furniture has been delivered and is being enjoyed by all. Pictures are included in the Empressions.

The Lobby door has been completely repainted by Jeff et al and looks brand new! Pictures are also included further along in this Empressions.

We are midway through the garage door panel replacement project with only a handful left to go!

Our stamped concrete driveway project, which will eventually include the gate entrance stamped concrete, is at a standstill as the paint that is needed to complete the project is totally unavailable from the supplier. We are pursuing other possibilities but at this time, supply is the problem we can't get by!

On October 6th, some residents awoke to a "great flood" discovered in the exercise room and parts of the social room. The rapid actions of Bill Borland, our fantastic maintenance team and Deb Taylor, ensured that all necessary tasks were handled to achieve a successful remediation including engaging our insurance company. In fact, all damages related to our mini-disaster have been repaired and as I write this, the finishing touches are being made in the exercise room as new carpeting is being installed.

The pickle ball court upgrades are underway. Thanks go to Mark Banta and the pickle ball enthusiasts for doing the leg work to make this a reality.

Finally, much progress has been made by the BOD and Ted Blanchard, one of our residents, regarding continued concrete maintenance plans for the Empress building.

In July, the BOD engaged the services of CSM, an engineering firm to do an evaluation of the building from a structural perspective. The report produced indicated that we have been doing a good job of keeping up with our concrete issues and suggested areas that needed to be addressed to continue to maintain the building from a preventative perspective. No structural issues were identified at this time.

To that end the BOD has initiated two (2) separate concrete projects. The first is underway and involves the Electrical Vault Room. All of you are receiving on going notifications about this effort as it is getting underway. The second effort is larger in nature and the BOD is in the final stages of a formal bidding process. More information will be coming as contracts are signed and plans are finalized.

CSM also recommended that we perform similar evaluations and maintenance plans every five (5) years. To that end the BOD is institutionalizing this recommendation in our financial planning within our reserve budget.
