

Axe Forging Class

Hello and thank you for your interest in the Axe Forging Class. This course is intended for students with little to no prior knowledge of blacksmithing. Included in this pamphlet is your sign-up sheet and liability waiver. If your schedule changes and you are not able to attend the class you have signed up for, please contact me as soon as possible. As for the always entertaining liability waiver form, which my insurance company makes me have everyone sign, the basic idea is this: blacksmithing and axes can be dangerous. The danger is significantly reduced by using the proper safety gear, using common sense and following the safety rules. It is my job to see to it that this class is safe and fun. Having said that there are times when I accidentally hurt myself in the shop. Minor scrapes and burns can happen. We will be working with hand tools and next to open flames. Also, this is a physical activity that will last for several hours over two days. Water and rest times are provided but if you feel that your physical conditioning will not allow you to participate then you may want to reconsider. So, if you accept these realities, and if smashing 2000-degree steel sounds like fun, then sign on up and we'll see you at the forge.

There is no official age requirement for this class. However, there are a few considerations for minors. First, I need a parent to sign the liability waiver and to accompany the student to the class. If the parent wants to take the class also that works out great but they don't have to. They can simply watch and there will be no fee for that. Next, the student will have to be able to handle the class. So, they will have to be strong enough to swing a 2 lb hammer and be able to focus on the tasks for that time. Having said that there are quite a few older teenagers who forge on a regular basis and it can be a great activity for them to get into.

Blacksmithing Class Liability Waiver Form

In consideration of Broken Hammer Forge and its instructor, David Collier, making these classes available and granting permission to enter the school of said classes, I hereby waive all claims for damage and/or loss to my person or property which may be caused by any act on my part, the part of the instructor, act of God or acts of my fellow students. I understand there are inherent dangers in blacksmithing and I assume the risk of all dangerous conditions in and about said classes. I also understand that blacksmithing can be physically demanding and I assert that I am in good physical condition and therefore able to handle the demands of the class. I also agree to follow and obey the safety rules and/or instructions of the class instructor. I understand and accept that if I fail to obey these rules and/or instructions it may result in my removal from the class and the forfeit of my registration fee. While axe throwing has become a popular hobby in recent years, there is obviously some inherent risk of danger with this activity. I will use proper safety gear and follow proper safety protocol when participating in this activity. I will not hold Broken Hammer Forge or the class instructor liable for any and all injuries which may occur while using my axe. I also accept that my registration fee is non-refundable if I fail to attend a class, cancel within two weeks of the class date or am unable to complete the class. By signing this, I acknowledge that I understand and accept this waiver and that I am at least 18 years of age.

Weekend Schedule:

Saturday:

8:00 – noon: morning session

What to expect:

The school is held indoors with fans and natural ventilation. Classes will alternate between verbal instruction and demonstration followed by hands on practice. The Sunday session will include heat treating and handle assembly. Small class size allows for more individualized instruction. We will have pizza for lunch on Saturday. If you have dietary needs feel free to bring a lunch. We have a fridge and microwave on site. End time will vary somewhat depending on the class (such and size) but we should finish up before lunch on Sunday. There will be the opportunity to try out throwing your axe if you want to.

Please bring the following gear:

- full length pants; preferably jeans (unless the forecast calls for hot weather)
- closed toe shoes (work boots are ideal)
- gloves (leather is ideal, no synthetic materials, must be able to have good dexterity with them, they should come off easily, no large welding gloves)
- shirts should be made from natural materials to prevent melting or flash-burning
- long hair will need to be pulled back.
- camera and note taking material if you wish
- please keep in mind that we will be working with coal which tends to be somewhat dirty, so older work clothes may be best

The following gear will be provided:

- safety goggles, aprons, ear plugs

Also provided:

There will be coffee each morning. Water will be available throughout the sessions. All materials and tools are provided but if you have a favorite hammer you wish to bring please feel free.

Registration and Cancellation Policies:
