Follow-up to 2022 Japanese Knotweed (JK) Spraying. We are seeing significant JK die off a month after our first '23 follow-up spraying.

The SLAWQ team plans to cut down any standing JK in late Aug prior to a fall respray.

Temperature Array. The Silver Lake temperature array has been inoperable for about a year. Rob Ritz has designed and built a new array. The plan is to work with Karl Hanafin (original array developer) and Todd Shuskey (PCHS) to install this unit at a new, lower traffic site and establish connectivity.

<u>Silver Lake Sewer System.</u> SLAWQ has reached out to the VoP to set-up a tour of the local sewer treatment plant. Alex Emmerson (Mark & Mary Emmerson's son) plans to join us on a tour. Alex is the plant supervisor for the Buffalo Sewer Authority.

Improper Leaf and Yard Waste Disposal into Silver Lake. SLAWQ hopes to work with the SLWC to create a local policy / ordinance to address leaf and yard waste disposal into Silver Lake.
