Labour delivering affordable homes for local families

Councillors Athwal and Solanki met with local families who were over the moon to have moved into our new council development on Marylon Road.

The completion of the Marlyon Road project means 48 local families are able to enjoy new high quality, affordable homes to call their own.

For too long previous local Conservative administrations failed to build any council housing in Redbridge, helping fuel the London-wide housing crisis and push waiting lists for council homes in our borough to record highs, with the average wait-time for a 3 bedroom home around 13 years.

When Labour came into power in 2014 we built the first new Redbridge council homes in over a decade, giving local families a safe, affordable place to stay. We're continuing our affordable housing programme to reduce waiting lists and help our neighbours have a place to call their own.



Street Iftaar

Councillors Athwal and Khan joined Redbridge Deputy Mayoress Cllr Namreen Chaudhary and other community leaders for a Street Iftaar event at Ilford Islamic Centre on Saturday April 15th.

Commenting about the event, ClIr Athwal said "Iftar Mubarak. Great to be able to break fast with my neighbours at the Ilford Islamic Centre in Albert Road. The diversity is best illustrated by the Church, the Mandir and the Masjid all being neighbours in Albert Road.".

ClIr Athwal also joined students from Catherham High School at an Iftaar event hosted at the National History Museum on Monday April 17.

Councillors Athwal officially opened the new sensory garden in Loxford on Monday April 1th, and was able to see for himself the impact that it is having on local children.

A huge thanks is due to Loxford School and & First Step Pre-School for helping to make this a reality and giving our young people the best start in life.



Sewage Scandal Letter

Councillors Athwal, in his role as the next Ilford South Labour Parliamentary candidate, joined Shadow Secretary of State for the Environment (Jim McMahon OBE MP), environmental campaigner Feargal Sharkey OBE and dozens of other Labour parliamentary candidates in asking the Conservative government to enshrine in law a requirement to end the systematic dumping of sewage into our environment.

Cllr Athwal said "it is a disgrace that the government continues to allow big businesses to pollute our water with raw sewage. I'm supporting Jim McMahon's motion so that the Labour Party can pass a law to save our rivers & stop polluters dumping sewage in our water."
