

Redbridge ranks 1st in London for delivering value for money

A recent report by Impower has revealed that Redbridge Council ranks first in London and second nationally for delivering value for money to its residents. The consultancy assessed various performance metrics and budget allocations, acknowledging the financial challenges councils face while highlighting those that continue to provide excellent services.

Despite being the third-lowest funded council in London, Redbridge is actively addressing the housing crisis, with 1 in 50 Londoners currently homeless. Councillor Kam Rai emphasised the significant impact of every pound spent in Redbridge, noting that the council strives to meet the growing demand for services, despite having lost 54% of government funding since 2010.

Redbridge's commitment to excellence is evident in its services, including children's services rated Outstanding by Ofsted. The council aims to maximise its resources, with a focus on improving local lives, while preparing to utilise any future funding effectively for the benefit of the community.
