Bungalow Estate AGM

At the recent Annual General Meeting of the Seven Kings Bungalow Estate Residents Association (SKBERA), Cllr Tanweer Khan was the guest speaker. He began by introducing himself, sharing insights into his personal, professional, and political background. He then discussed his role on the council, emphasising his commitment to championing the needs of Mayfield ward residents and keeping them well-informed about local developments.

Cllr Khan highlighted his position as Chair of the Pension Fund Committee, outlining his efforts to ensure the fund supports life-changing initiatives, particularly in poorer countries. He also addressed his role on the Safer Redbridge Policy Development Committee, focusing on tackling key issues such as fly-tipping, antisocial behaviour, and other nuisances like begging in the borough.

The evening concluded with a lively Q&A session, where residents raised concerns about issues within the Bungalow Estate. Cllr Khan urged everyone to stay engaged with the council by following its social media accounts, signing up for email newsletters, and joining the secure WhatsApp group established for residents' communication.

The SKBERA committee thanked Cllr Khan for engaging with them and addressing their concerns.



Room 151 Roundtable on Emerging Markets

Cllr Khan, as Chair of the LB Redbridge Pension Fund Committee, attended the Room 151 Roundtable on Emerging Markets. He stressed that while the LGPS has fiduciary duties, it must also consider the broader global impact of investments.

Emerging markets often focus on countries like China, but Cllr Khan highlighted the importance of expanding into regions like sub-Saharan Africa, where investments could be life-changing for communities. This approach supports responsible investment and creates opportunities for lasting, meaningful impact.



Mayfield Ward Panel

The Mayfield Ward Panel, composed of local residents and the Mayfield Safer Neighbourhood Team (Metropolitan Police), meets regularly to address crime-related issues. Mayfield councillors also participate, working closely with the panel's chair to tackle urgent concerns.

Recent discussions have covered anti-social behaviour in South Park Crescent, the impact of DPD vans on Mortlake Road, and requests for CCTV on the Bungalow Estate.

At the latest meeting on Thursday, 17th October 2024, the panel reaffirmed its priorities: violence against women and girls, anti-social behaviour, drug-related issues, and Blue Badge thefts.

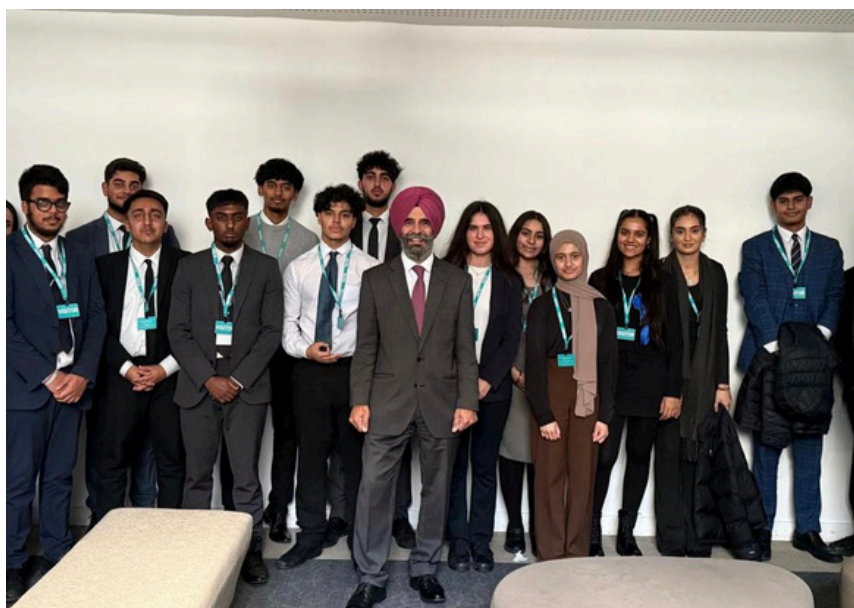
