We hold the police accountable to keep us safe, and we have seen big improvements but we all want more and it's why we are investing more into CCTV and our own enforcement teams.

LOOKING AFTER OUR ENVIRONMENT

PLEDGE – Protect All our Parks from Development, 4 New Pocket Parks and Retain our 9 Green Flag Parks

As Redbridge residents, we are all rightfully proud and protective of our green spaces, and we are committed to ensuring that these vital assets are preserved for future generations.



Under Labour, we will maintain 9 Green Flag Parks, an international recognition of excellence, and we're investing an extra £2 million in park toilets.

Additionally, we will create 4 new Pocket Parks, which will **transform neglected urban areas into vibrant community spaces for everyone**. They will also help to reduce flooding in key areas of the borough, building on the work we have completed to help alleviate flooding risks across the borough – regular drain maintenance, rain gardens and soil barriers.

We will also protect all our parks from development, and instead, continue to invest and expand them, just like our 250-acre expansion of Fairlop Waters and restoration of Hainault Forest.

With £3 Million from the Greater London Authority, we will open up green spaces along the river Roding, connecting Ilford to Wanstead with cycling and walking paths.

Our Labour Council has committed to delivering our climate change strategy and creating a clear set of objectives on improving biodiversity and the nature emergency we declared with local people. **We will plant 20,000 trees, 1000 street trees, add 500 rapid electric vehicle charge points**, and create additional allotments and community gardens. Ensuring that all communities have access to even more green spaces and green energy. **Redbridge Labour will do its part to address the climate emergency.**

ENSURING OPPORTUNITY FOR EVERY CHILD

PLEDGE – 100% of Schools rated Good or Outstanding and Build a New School for Children with SEND

We have excellent schools across Redbridge, and a great education should be a right of every child in our borough, not a privilege. That is why we are committing to ensuring that 100% of our schools will be rated Good or Outstanding.



This commitment to every child's education includes those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). By building **a new SEND school in Redbridge**, we will ensure that fewer children have to leave the borough to secure the education they deserve. On top of this, **we will build a new SEND-specific play space** that enables SEND children to be nurtured and included.

Redbridge Labour is proud to be the first council in England to become a UNICEF Child Friendly borough, meaning we are a place that puts children and their needs at the forefront of all we do, with a commitment to listening to them.

We are proud of our Outstanding Ofsted-rated Children's Services, and we will continue to ensure that every child grows up feeling valued and supported.

We will create educational resources alongside schools and parents to keep our children safe when online.

Building on this work, **we will institute a ten-by-ten guarantee, ensuring that every child in the borough achieves ten key milestones by the age of ten.** This ambition is based on enriching a child's experience alongside a great education. Learning to ride a bike, swim, debate and taking part in music and drama should not be dictated by your postcode. Experiencing the richness of museums, theatres, using a library, exercising and visiting the seaside are the rights of every child.

Redbridge Labour will ensure this; your child's education is secure with us.

KEEPING OUR STREETS CLEAN

PLEDGE – Weekly Bin Collections, Free Bulky Waste, Free Garden Waste, and New Recycling Wheelie Bins for Everyone

We've protected all of your weekly bin collections, and with Redbridge Labour, they're here to stay.

Keeping our streets clean and protecting our local environment is crucial to us, and we know it's important to you too.

This is why we're investing £3 million in new recycling wheelie bins for everyone. They will replace your smaller boxes and ensure that even more waste is kept off our streets.

For the rubbish that slips through the gaps or is deliberately fly-tipped, we have a clear plan. We will invest in modern, state-of-the-art cleaning equipment, and **our new Rapid Response Team will clear up graffiti and littering.**

Our street cleaning teams will deal with high streets, pavements and roads – we're investing an extra £1 million into these services annually.



Through using AI, and on-vehicle cameras to detect and report fly-tips, potholes and other on-street issues, we will ensure they get dealt with in record time. Additionally, with our £1000 fines for fly-tippers, we're coming down hard on this blight from every angle. Utilising CCTV we will clamp down on people that litter from their vehicles.

Beyond the streets, we're cleaning the very air we breathe, and we've successfully cut harmful pollutants by 40%. We will continue to improve your air quality, **ensuring that living, playing and working in Redbridge is in a safe and clean environment.**

A GREAT PLACE TO GROW OLD

PLEDGE – Protect the Freedom Pass and Ensure that Redbridge is a Great Place to Grow Old

Redbridge Labour believes in the Freedom Pass, and we are committed to continuing to fund it for every eligible resident. While other parties have threatened to scrap this vital lifeline, we understand that for many, the Freedom Pass is the difference between isolation and independence. **On May 7th, the Freedom Pass is effectively on the ballot; only a Labour Council will guarantee its future.**

Making Redbridge a great place to grow old means Redbridge is a borough of dignity, providing high-quality social care and ensuring that our public spaces are accessible and welcoming. This is why we will be increasing our Adult Social Care budget to £28.8 million, ensuring that no one is left behind.

With the additional £61.5 million we successfully lobbied from Government, we will invest in mental health services, learning disabilities services, grants, and caring for patients discharged from hospital.



We're countering social isolation through lunch clubs, sports, coffee mornings and the creation of community spaces for voluntary organisations across Redbridge. This work will include rewarding inclusive activities for children with SEND who have transitioned into adulthood.

Redbridge Labour has successfully been able to increase the accessibility of our local transport networks. **Our step-free access campaigns for Newbury Park, South Woodford and Snaresbrook stations were successful,** and we will continue to push for step-free access at Barkingside station.

Accessibility is a non-negotiable for Redbridge Labour, no one should be locked out of using public services.

A SAFER REDBRIDGE

PLEDGE – £5.5 Million to Upgrade CCTV and ANPR Cameras to Fight Anti-Social Behaviour

Safety is the foundation of a thriving community. We will empower residents to hold the Police to account alongside us and **demand a fully resourced local police team in every single ward.**

Due to our no-nonsense approach and proactive work with the police, we have seen a decrease in crime across the borough. Redbridge Labour will not stop this work, and we will continue to ensure that every community is safer and benefits from our investment.

Through the expansion of our council enforcement teams and CCTV and ANPR camera network across the borough, with £5.5 million of targeted investment, we will continue to ensure our police are supported. We will double the size of our Trading Standards and Environmental Health teams and we will work with the Labour Government **to reject license applications for businesses that harm our communities** such as betting shops.

Redbridge Labour is setting a bold target **to cut Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) in half by 2034.** We recognise that this requires a systemic shift in how we approach safety, enforcement, and education.

Our diverse communities across Redbridge make our borough great, every day people of all faiths and none contribute to our borough.

This is why dealing with bigotry, racism, and the rise in antisemitism and islamophobia is so important.

Where extremist politics seeks to divide and demean, Redbridge Labour will bring together and celebrate, and our planned Community Cohesion review will do exactly that.

Our borough has always been a safe haven, whoever you are, we will ensure this continues to be the case by **standing up for all of Redbridge.**

DEALING WITH POVERTY AND INEQUALITY

PLEDGE – Provide £18.4 Million in Cost of Living Support for Those Most in Need

Redbridge residents are being impacted by the legacy of the Conservative Cost of Living Crisis. Our borough will receive £4.6 million a year over the next 4 years from the Labour government to support families and local people in financial crisis, providing a lifeline and guidance.

We will ensure that more money stays in people's pockets by continuing to support our Community Grocery store, which we helped to set up in 2023. where thousands of regular users can get discounted shop and access a range of other services

Fighting food inequality for people across Redbridge is crucial for our long-term health. This is why we provided a permanent home in Woodford for the Food Bank so they can serve people across all of Redbridge. We have now committed to doing the same with the Felix Project, the **largest food charity in the country. Over 13,000 children across Redbridge are provided with free school meals**, showing our continued commitment to making sure no child goes hungry.



We will increase the availability of after-school youth activities across the borough in community centres and youth spaces

We have established a welfare benefits team that each year works with our neighbours, identifying around £1 million of unclaimed benefits such as carers' and attendance allowance for those who support disabled family members. We worked with the Labour Government to remove the two-child limit, **helping to lift thousands of Redbridge children out of poverty.** Redbridge Labour will ensure a fairer, more secure future for everyone.

We will expand our healthy bus services, that provides free health checks in your neighborhood with no appointments necessary. We will continue to improve the health of our communities by increasing access.

DEVELOPING OUR LOCAL ECONOMY

PLEDGE – 5000 New Apprenticeships and Jobs for Local Young People

We are committed to building a local economy that works for everyone, not just some. By creating 5,000 new apprenticeships and jobs, specifically for local young people, we want to ensure that the talent born in Redbridge stays in Redbridge. By partnering with local businesses, major contractors, charities and partner organisations, we will create pathways into high-skilled, well-paid industries.

Under previous Conservative Governments, the number of young people not in education or employment skyrocketed. We are committed to dealing with this issue and ensuring that Redbridge is a borough where young people can get on in life and achieve their potential. **Our Redbridge Youth Guarantee** is the first step in addressing this issue. As part of this commitment, every single one of our libraries will remain open.

Our high streets across the borough are the heartbeat of our local areas, and we must retain the best, and attract new positive additions.



Redbridge Labour's business incentive package will include guidance, funding support and help with business rates as they establish. Ensuring that they are supported by their council and given the opportunity to thrive.

We are planning to expand on our exciting new business, enterprise and workspace hub, Queen Victoria House in Barkingside, that provides business support and collaboration – bringing the council and entrepreneurs together.

We will ensure that these new businesses will benefit local residents, enhance our borough and boost our economy, supporting them to sign up to our **Fair Employment Charter** by employing local people on at least the London Living Wage. **If you work in Redbridge, you should be able to live in Redbridge. We will help make that the case.**

AFFORDABLE AND SECURE HOUSING

PLEDGE – 1000 New Social Homes and Crack Down on Rogue Landlords

Redbridge Labour believes that a stable home is the foundation for a secure life.

Right to buy has decimated council housing stock across the country, but we are committed to addressing this, just as we have done over the past four years. Ensuring that the most vulnerable in Redbridge get the housing they deserve.

Through our commitment to **invest £57 million into new council homes**, we will also create 1000 new socially affordable homes. **We will do this while ensuring that there is no development on our parks.** Our green spaces are our pride and joy, and any new housing should not come at the cost of services that local residents rely on.

New homes must be high quality, the right type and in the right place. We will stamp down, with zero tolerance, on planning breaches, and are working with the Labour government on stronger powers for local authorities.



Houses of multiple occupation (HMO's) will be limited to the bare minimum. Using all our powers, we will tackle rogue and absent landlords with a 50% increase in our enforcement team.

Everyone in Redbridge deserves a place to call home. This is why we are also investing **£13.9 million to support local residents facing homelessness and rough sleeping.** We will do all we can to ensure everyone has a place to call home.

We're investing **£31.4 million over the next term to improve and upgrade our current housing stock.** Tackling poor quality and repairing housing, **ensuring that people can be proud of the place that they live in.**

HELPING FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES THRIVE

PLEDGE – Create NEW Family Support Hubs, a Climbing Centre, and a Leisure Centre

Families are the heart of Redbridge. We are committed to supporting them at every stage of life.



By creating two new bespoke Family Support Centres in accessible locations, we will ensure that every family has the support they need.

These hubs will be wrap-around, where parents and caregivers can access health visitors, childcare, employment support, housing help and mental health services in one welcoming location. **Building community, resilience and creating fairness from pregnancy all the way to adulthood.**

We will deliver new pickleball courts by the summer, and complete the refurbishments of the Kenneth More Theatre and Fullwell Cross Leisure Centre by the end of the year. We want to build a national-level Climbing Centre, and the Leisure Centre in Valentines Park. Alongside delivering food and arts annual festivals and outdoor cinema events, **ensuring there is always more to do as a family.**

Redbridge Labour is committed to ensuring equal access and opportunity. **We will expand our trailblazing megamix programme,** giving every child affordable access to arts, sports and cultural activities each summer and Easter holiday. Our collaboration with the Future Leaders programme is vital in providing guidance and inspiration for 16–18 year olds, levelling up access to carers and higher education will continue and grow. All children in our borough should have the opportunity to excel and unlock their talent no matter their background.

We believe local people know their neighbourhoods best. **Redbridge Labour will provide up to £20,000 grants for community groups** that serve our diverse communities, share our values and give back to our borough, building resilience and fairness from the ground up.

FIXING OUR STREETS

PLEDGE – £35 million to Fix our Streets

Over the past four years, Redbridge Labour has worked tirelessly to modernise our infrastructure, **resurfacing over 227,000 square metres of road and filling 56,626 potholes.** We are now committing £35 million to further transform our local road networks and pavements for the long term.

We will continue to improve safety for pedestrians, cyclists, and drivers alike through a robust, evidence-based approach:

Tackling Roadwork Chaos: We will hold utility companies to a higher standard by making them pay increased fees for roadworks. We will use every legal power available to minimise disruption and prevent the same road from being dug up repeatedly, ensuring our traffic keeps moving.

Zero Tolerance for Dangerous Parking: We will institute a new towing service, this will specifically target vehicles parked dangerously and repeat offenders.

Supporting our High Streets: Accessibility is at the core of our vision. We have already created 201 extra disabled bays on our high streets to ensure everyone can shop locally with dignity.



Furthermore, we have protected our one-hour free parking to support our small businesses and make a quick trip to the shops easier for every resident.

Lighting the Way: Since 2022, we have upgraded 625 street lights. Redbridge Labour will continue our vital Women's Safety lantern column upgrades, ensuring that our residential streets and walkways are well-lit and safe for everyone.

Safer Journeys for All: Building on the 10 new signalised and zebra crossings we've delivered, we will continue to address dangerous driving and speeding through targeted enforcement and the installation of modern traffic calming measures.

Whether you are walking to school, cycling to work, or driving across the borough, **Redbridge Labour is dedicated to making every single journey in our home safer, smoother, and more reliable.**
