
IMAGES IN THE READINGS

The language of being **raise**d from death relies on the commonplace human idea, evident in speech and story, that up is good and down is bad. The ancient three-tier universe placed divine powers on the top level, humans in the middle—between life and death—and the dead below the earth. In today's readings, Jesus has been raised (Luke, Paul, Acts) up from death. Current scientific understandings of the universe teach us that there is no "up." Yet many languages maintain this imagery: the brain is up, dirty feet are down. Thus this language must function for us symbolically: up is life, down is death.

Jews during inter-testamental times developed the belief in a final **resurrection**. The situation under foreign powers was so intractable that there was no present hope. Rather, at the end of time, God would bring an end to this evil and in a general resurrection would raise to new life all the righteous dead. Influence from especially Zoroastrianism added the idea that those who were evil would be raised to eternal punishment. The New Testament speaks of Christ's resurrection as the beginning of this phenomenon.

The noun **Jerusalem** has many meanings. It was the site of the temple, where Israelites and later Jews connected with God. Isaiah used it as shorthand for the restored life in the Promised Land. It is the location of Jesus' crucifixion and the origin of the Christian mission. Especially in their use of the Psalms, Christians interpret it to mean the church. It is also a contemporary deeply troubled city that functions in different ways for competing religious pieties.

In 1 Corinthians 15 and Romans 5, Paul contrasts **Adam** with Christ. Adam is the sinful human, Christ the second Adam who reversed the effects of sin by divine grace. Paul is not interested in the narrative details of Genesis 3, but rather interprets the Genesis story in the light of Christ. For Paul, those who are baptized are now enlivened not by the natural Adam but by Christ, the son of God.
