Line Limit: 5

This is an unrhymed poem composed of lines containing the following syllables:

 1^{st} line = five 2^{nd} line = seven 3^{rd} line = five 4^{th} line = seven 5^{th} line = seven

MUSTS:

"The tanka comprised the majority of Japanese poetry from the 9th to the 19th century. The first three lines are the origin of the haiku. The last two lines in a tanka are often a shift that expands upon the subject matter." Source: A Poet's Glossary by Edward Hirsch.

SHOULDS: <u>Tanka poetry</u>, as a Japanese mood poem should include literary devices such as personnification, metaphors, and similes to allow ample visualization. *Note: many traditional tankas found online are translated from the Japanese and therefore will have a different syllable county than required for your English version.

Tanka Example: Oh, were the white waves, Far on the glimmering sea That the moonshine laves, Dream flowers drifting to me,— I would cull them, love, for thee ---Sadakichi Hartmann
