

April 2020 Open Contest Guidelines Modern Ballad

Deadline: April 18, 2020

Sponsor: Cheryl Wilkie

Theme: Optional

Form: Modern Ballad

Line Limit: 40

MUSTS:

1. The ballad must be a narrative poem (one that tells a story).

- 2. The ballad must be divided into stanzas, either traditional 4-line stanzas, or a stanza length of the poet's choice.
- 3. The ballad must rhyme, but the rhyme pattern is poet's choice
- 4. The ballad must differ from traditional ballads by introducing something modern (in setting, characters, plot, style, theme, technology, etc.).

POSSIBILITIES:

- 1. The ballad's rhythm pattern might be traditional (iambic tetrameter/trimeter), a different rhythm, or free verse (no set rhythm). Poet's choice.
- 2. The ballad might or might not have a refrain (a repeated stanza). Poet's choice.
