

In this report, you'll read Fiona and Bennie's story of determination and commitment to overcoming the obstacles of having a baby as teen parents. Their story is one of resilience and hope.

Every year we work in-depth with about 40 families like Fiona and Bennie's. Our families face many of the same challenges of any new parent - sleepless nights and an emotional roller coaster as you tend to the needs of an infant. Yet our families often face additional issues such as barriers to staying in school, unstable housing, lack of food, unreliable transportation, financial challenges, and so much more.

Coupled with being young, having little or no family support, and lacking the concrete resources to provide for their baby, teen parents need and deserve the support of their larger community.

> 2024 promises to be a year of growth for Generations Ahead. We are excited to expand our work with young fathers, recognizing how critical their role is in a child's life. We recently hired our first Development Coordinator, allowing us to advance our reach and expand awareness to more people. 

Fiona and Bennie lived on her mother's property in a trailer with no bathroom, heat, or running water. When they first learned about Generations Ahead, they were 19 years old and Fiona was ten weeks pregnant. Facing the frigid November days of northern Michigan their future seemed uncertain, but they were determined to build a stable life for their growing family.

Generations Ahead provided support and became a champion for this young family during a time that felt overwhelming. Fiona and Bennie were connected with critical resources after Generations Ahead secured a grant to weatherize their precarious living situation into a safer, warmer space. After urgent needs were met, Generations Ahead provided a dependable, inclusive village that helped strengthen their resilience and foster positive relationships. Fiona and Bennie attended private childbirth classes, in partnership with Munson, gaining valuable knowledge and confidence. Additionally, Fiona was paired with a dedicated, compassionate mentor who was a guiding light in her housing search, and ultimately assisted Fiona's family with moving into their own apartment.

Fiona and Benny fiercely strive for independence and self-sufficiency. Since giving birth to their daughter in 2023, they coordinated working They say it takes a village to raise a child, and our community has an opportunity to be that village for the families that Generations Ahead serves.

Additionally, Fiona attended our 3-series cooking classes for some social time with peers doing an activity she loves.

As Fiona has matured and gained confidence in her new role as a mother, she has become a beacon of connection within our community welcoming new parents and inviting them to participate and driving those in need to our events. Fiona is a shining example of how connections can transform lives. Her genuine warmth and commitment has made a profound impact, strengthening the very community that has supported her.

Fiona's journey exemplifies the power of Generations Ahead's mission: to build resiliency by





Internship Program

Clients participating in our internship program are paired with a local company aligned with their professional interests. Participation in the paid 50 hour internship promotes the development of basic employment skills, and provides knowledge and job contacts in their desired field.

Programs & Services

Creating a safe, fun, engaging space for teen parents and their children.

100% of programs and services are provided at no cost to the families served.

BABY PANTRY has all the supplies needed for babies, toddler, and moms - with 90% of our supplies donated by the community.

MENTOR PROGRAM pairs young parents with a caring, trained volunteer mentor who provides individualized support.

FAMILY ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES provide an opportunity for young parents to connect with each other and engage in child-friendly activities to address the social-emotional needs of the parents.

PLAY GROUPS offer opportunities for parents to socialize with each other and their little ones while increasing positive parenting practices and child development knowledge, fostering a stronger child/parent bond.

CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES assist with a variety of needs including basic resources, parenting struggles, health concerns, relationships, educational goals, etc..

PARTNERS OF JOY: Our holiday program allows a group or business to shower our families with gifts during the season, relieving some financial pressure and helping our parents feel loved!

Mentors provide support and encouragement when our teen moms and dads have no other caring adult to help them. With their time and attention, mentors show our young parents that they are important and deserving of care. After attending a 4 week training, mentors may be matched with a parent, or provide more informal support such as transportation, or help at a group activity.




