Accessing Rossington church services on the 12th of June

Road closures and diversion will be in place in the area from 06:00-14:00, runners will be heading through Rossington Village from 09:30-11:30 on the day and we expect 1000 runners for this year.

Our aim is to inspire physical activity, help bring communities together and raise money for local charities. This year the event is supporting Club Doncaster Foundation, Yorkshire Wildlife Trust, Firefly and the Doncaster Deaf Trust (to name a few)

All churches in the village are accessible for the duration of the event but we advise pre-planning your route in and out and allowing a little more time than usual.

Access to Rossington


- Access to Rossington from Doncaster or Bawtry direction is via the Great North Road, if heading in from Bawtry then you will simply follow the
 road in via Sheep Bridge Lane. If heading from Doncaster then you will turn into Rossington up Sheeps Bridge Lane as normal to join the one way
 system.
- If you normally access Rossington via Stripe Road then for all churches with the exception of St Michaels this is fine and you will turn down Bond Street as Clay Flat Lane is closed. For St Michaels please come via the Great North Road heading in from Bawtry and enter via Sheep Bridge Lane.

Navigating the village

- Rossington will have a one way system in place throughout the event on the run route, this is heading east to west from Sheep Bridge Lane out through West End Lane and joining the Great Yorkshire Way to the M18 at the iport roundabout.
- Navigating out of and around the village. Due to the one way system, heading out of the village via Stripe Road to Sheep Bridge Lane to Doncaster will not be possible, heading out Stripe Road to Tickhill direction is still fully open as is heading to M18 junc 3 via West End Lane.
- For all Churches West of the trainline. Once into Rossington then Clay Flat Lane will be closed off at Stripe Road but simply continue to the next turn to Bond street to navigate through the village. All the blue areas on the following map are open to traffic.
- The Great Yorkshire Way is fully closed from the i-port roundabout until Parrots corner (where it joins Bawtry Road), please head into Doncaster and follow diversions to Rossington.

Runners in Rossington: 09:30-11:33

Red section:

No direct access/exit 08:00-11:30. Right turn only if escorted out by traffic team and (safe to do so.)

Blue section: Access / exit throughout. Left turn only in place from 08:00-11:30 when leaving properties (if on the run route.)

A one-way system is in place throughout the event on the run route. The road is separated by cones, and please take care when travelling through Rossington during the event, as runners will be in the closed section of the road.

Take care throughout the event, as runners will be in the road. Road closures are in place to support runners' safety throughout the event. If unsure, then please interact with one of the traffic team in the area ,who will be able to advise you.

Thank you for your support – our best advice for the day is, if you can from 09-00-12:00, join your community in supporting the runners coming through the area. If you do need to leave, or access your property, the event is likely to delay you, so please allow for extra time and plan ahead.
