About YWP Foundation

Yorkshire Wildlife Park Foundation was established in 2013 and since then has fast become an influential voice in welfare and conservation. We've worked with organisations around the world on projects to help improve the welfare of animals, provide protection for endangered species and support vital research into the impacts of climate change on many species.

We've helped the conservation of all kinds of animals great and small from polar bears in Svalbard to critically blue-eyed black lemurs in Madagascar. We've helped giraffes relocate in Africa and protected black rhino in Kenya. We enabled 6 Bactrian Camels to be released into the wild. Last year YWPF supported a Rehabilitation and Rescue Reserve for brown bears rescued from Japan and funded enrichment and welfare improvements for animals at Hanoi Zoo in Vietnam. In fact, we have supported projects on every continent except Antarctica so far.



