

Jelly On Point

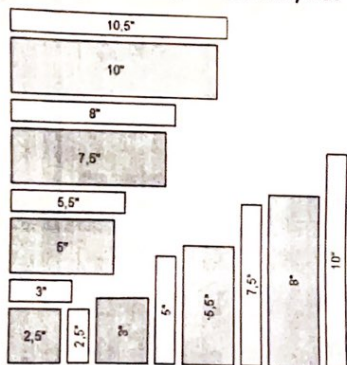
1 strip of batik $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42" (or enough batik scraps to equal that amount)
1 strip of background fabric $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 42"

Cut your batik strip into the following pieces:
2.5" 3" 5" 5.5" 7.5" 8" 10"

Cut your background strip into two 1" x WOF strips. Cut the 1" strips into the following:
2.5" 3" 5" 5.5" 7.5" 8" 10" 10.5"

*****To assemble this block, it is important to use an exact $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. You may want to test your $\frac{1}{4}$ " before you begin. 🐼**

Lay out your strips next to your machine like this:



Start with the 2.5" square and add the 2.5" strip of background fabric. Press the seam open with your fingernail or a pressing tool. No steam!!! It is important that you press after EVERY seam that you sew!!

Next add the 3" background strip to the top of the unit you just made. Press seam open. Next add the 3" batik strip to the right and press, then the 5" batik strip to the top and press, then the 5" background strip to the right and press, then the 5.5" background strip to the top and press. You get the idea.....!

When your block is finished, you may take it to the ironing board for a final press. No steam!!

Your block will look like this:
It should measure $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
