Block of the Month

Block of the month that is due at July's meeting is called Christmas Mountain.

If you want to purchase a Grunge 10" square so you can participate in the BOM send a self addressed stamped envelope and \$1.00 to:

Christmas Mountains

drawn line

Purchase one white/cream Grunge 10" square
Select one quilt shop quality 10" square from your own stash

Draw a diagonal line from opposite corners on the white square

Place the two squares right sides together. Sew a scant quarter inch line on both sides of the

Cut on the drawn line to separate the created half square triangles Open the triangles and press seams toward the Christmas fabric The two half square triangles need to measure 9 ½" square

Align the two squares next to each other so that the Christmas fabric creates a mountain. You are creating mirror image blocks

Cut vertically through the blocks at 2 3/8", 4 3/4", and 7 1/8" being careful to keep the two blocks separate but aligned in the mountain formation

Take the four pieces from one block and switch #1 with #4, and #2 with #3. Sew pieces together with a quarter inch seam. Repeat with second block. Blocks should measure 8" by 9 ½"

Budget present Maggie Mulroy

The Endowment figure includes things like State Fair, County Fairs, Library donation for quilting books, Quilt Museum in Cedarburg, Education, PBS, Fabric for quilts, batting and backing. 3 Scholarships are given out – WCTC, MATC, and Gateway.

Motion made by Linda Forster to increase programs amount. Joline Palatino clarified the motion to increase it to \$7,000. The Pandemic has changed how programs can be presented. Many people do not want in person programs anymore. Mary Wick seconded. Motion carried, Programs budget will be increased to \$7,000.

Challenge area – would like to see \$50 added for prizes. This is included in the Show budget.

Hostess Budget – Joline Palatino motioned to increase the Hostess budget from \$250 to \$350. Tammy Lindner seconded. Motion carried.

Karen Keys made a motion to provide \$300 in the budget for Historical / Historian to work toward getting the Guild historical data to a better place. Jane Busse seconded. Motion carried.

It was noted that an AdHoc committee would be formed to address use for any excess budget amount.

\$1,475 from the Show Boutique was sent to Seniors On The Go. Brooke filled out the paperwork and mailed the check. There was a desire to do a presentation, but the check was already mailed.

Barbara Blessman motioned to adopt the budget as discussed, including the changes listed (\$7000 for Programs, \$350 for Hostess, \$300 for Historical). Chris Petersen seconded. Motion carried.
