Salah and Tarbiyah Q&A – Part 3

Age Group: Ages 6-12 years

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Salah Q&A

Q1: How much water should I use to clean myself in the toilette?

A: You should only use that much water which is necessary to clean yourself thoroughly. When you feel that you are clean, then stop using water immediately. Wasting water is against Sunnah of our dear Prophet ﷺ.

Q2: I know I should not be reading any dua inside the toilet. If I forget, I must read it in my heart. But can I go out of the toilet to read it?

A: Yes, you can go out of the toilet and read it. However, if you feel the urge to relieve yourself immediately, you should read it in your heart and then relieve yourself.

Q3: I am in the toilet to relieve myself. Should I take off all my clothes before relieving myself?

A: No, there is no need to undress completely. You should only undress as much as is required. However, you must make sure that my body and my clothes remain clean from any urine or stool.



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Q4: Where should I start to undress to relieve myself in the toilet?

A: You should undress yourself when you are near the commode/squat toilet.

Q5: I know I should not delay going to the toilet. But if I am doing something important (e.g., taking a class), and I know I can control myself till my work finishes, is it OK to delay going to the toilet?

A: Yes, in this situation, you can delay going to the toilet. However, you must make sure that you do not get uncomfortable during this delay. If you do, then you should go to the toilet immediately.

Q6: If my teacher does not give me permission to go to the toilet, what should I do?

A: First, I should try to explain to the teacher as much as possible that I am in pain and I need to go to the toilet. If the teacher still refuses, then you should say that the pain is not bearable. Then leave the classroom and go to toilet. Later, you should apologize to the teacher and the principal, and you should not feel bad about it.

Q7: What should you care about before sitting on the commode?

A: Clean the seat of the commode before sitting on it. If there is already water or urine on it, then your body and clothes will become unclean (نجس). You then need to clean that part of your body and wash the unclean part of the cloth.



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Q8: What should you care about before sitting on the squat toilet?

A: You should ensure that there is no dirt on the area in which you place your feet. If you are not wearing slippers, and that place is dirty, then you will need to wash the dirt off, i.e., wash and clean your feet thoroughly.

Q9: I wear glasses. Where should I keep my glasses when I want to do wudu or do ghusl (bath)?

A: It is better to keep your glasses outside the bathroom. You can also keep them in the bathroom but there is a danger that they might break. Also, in the bathroom, they might get wet, so you must clean them later.

Q10: How much tap to open for doing wudu or ghusl?

A: You should not open the tap fully or very little. You should open it so that it gives you just enough water to do wudu or ghusl properly. It should not be so little that your body remains dry at some place where it should be wet.

Q11: Is my wudu broken if I clean my nose?

A: No, cleaning your nose does not break your wudu. You do not need to do wudu again.

Q12: In which situation is my wudu broken (نواقص وضو)?

A: Your wudu is broken in the following situations:



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- Passing urine
- Passing stool
- Letting out air
- Blood comes out of your body, and it starts to flow
- Pus comes out of your body, and it starts to flow
- You vomit with your mouth full
- Your back is resting against some support. If this support is removed, then you will fall. With this support, if you fall asleep even for one second, the wudu will be broken.
- Fainting (even for one minute or less) breaks your wudu
- Laughing loudly (cackle – قهقهه) while saying your Salah breaks your wudu

Q13: Is my wudu broken if blood or pus comes out of my body and it does not flow?

A: No, your wudu is not broken if the blood and pus do not flow.

Q14: Is my wudu broken if a small amount of vomit comes out of my mouth?

A: No, your wudu is not broken with a small amount of vomiting.

Q15: Is my wudu broken if water comes out of my nose or eyes?

A: No, your wudu is not broken if water comes out of your nose or eyes.

Q16: If I touch the body parts from which urine or stool comes out, is my wudu broken?



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A: No.

Q17: If I undress, or my clothes fall from my body accidentally, is my wudu broken?

A: No

Q18: If maggots (دودة / كيرته) come out of my injury, my nose or ear, then is my wudu broken?

A: No

Q19: If phlegm (بلغم) comes out of my mouth in large quantity, is my wudu broken?

A: No, phlegm is not vomiting. So, even if there is a lot of phlegm coming out of our mouth, your wudu is not broken.

Q20: I am in the toilet, and someone says “Assalamoalaikum” to me from outside the toilet. What should I do?

A: You should not respond back. Be silent. When you leave the toilet, tell the person who said salaam to you that you were in the toilet and it is not allowed to talk while in the toilet (you can only talk in case of some emergency).

Q21: I am doing wudu and someone says “Assalmaoalaikum” to me. Should I respond back?



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A: No, it is not allowed to talk while doing wudu.

Q22. Can I talk with someone who is doing wudu?

A: No, you cannot talk with someone who is doing wudu.

Tarbiyah Q&A

Q1: Should I say Allah Haafiz (الله حافظ) or Khuda Haafiz (خدا حافظ) when parting with someone?

A: You can say Allah Haafiz or Khuda Haafiz but it is better that you say Assalamoalaikum (peace be on you) and then say Fee Amanillah (في امان الله).

Q2: Isn't it Fee AmaanAllah rather than Fee Amaanillah?

A: No, it is Fee Amaanillah (في امان الله) – there is a zayr (kasra - زير) on the noon (ن) of امان

Q3: I am sad that I have a small car and my Khaala (aunt) has a very big car. I am sad that I don't have a smart watch while my cousins have high-priced smart watches. I am sad that I am living on rent in a small house and my friend has a big house. Oh! Why didn't Allah Taala give me better things?

A: Allah Taala didn't give you those things because maybe they are not good for you yet. You should believe that when it is good for my Dunya (world) and Aakhirat (Hereafter) to get those things, then you will inshaAllah get those things.



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Allah Taala knows better than you do, and He will never want to bring you any harm.

Q4: Ok, I understand that Allah Taala wishes better for me. But it is hard for me to control my feelings. What should I do?

A: Think about Paradise before you go to bed at night. That is your real home. In Paradise, you will get blessings and gifts which are a million times better than the things in this world. If you don't have many things in this world, it is possible that you will get more in Paradise than those people who have more than you in this world.

Q5: I like this thought of Paradise. So, the worldly things are not permanent?

A: Yes, the worldly things of your family, friends and other people are not permanent. The big houses, big cars and smart watches are all given by Allah Taala to test human beings. They have been given only for some time. Then, Allah Taala will give these things to someone else.

Q6: Ok now I understand. So, what else can I do besides think about Paradise every day?

A: You should tell yourself to be patient in your wait for Paradise. Don't fret. Don't fidget. Don't agitate. Don't be sad. Don't be angry. Don't be thankless.

Q7: Oh! So, if I don't count my blessings and always look at what others have, then I am thankless?



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A: Yes. You are being thankless. And Allah Taala does not like thankless people. Allah Taala loves people who thank Him for what He has given them.

Q8: OK. I understand now. Tell me what will happen if I am thankful?

A: If you are thankful, then Allah Taala will inshaAllah give you what you don't have.

Q9: OK. I will be thankful from now on. Now, tell me what I should do if I need money.

A: You should make dua to Allah Taala after every Fard prayers to give you money.

Q10: Ok, should I not ask my parents if I want money?

A: You can ask your parents, but you should first make dua to Allah Taala and always believe that Allah Taala will give you the money, either through your parents or someone else.

Q11: I want to become a good student. I want to get good grades. Please tell me how:

A: Do the following:

- Never be absent from school without any valid reason (e.g., you are sick)
- Be in your class before the teacher comes in the class
- Greet the teacher by saying "Assalamoalaikum"
- Before the teacher starts teaching say: **بسم الله الرحمن الرحيم**



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- After bismillah, say: “Rabbi Sharah Lee Sadrii” (رب شرح لي صدي) – O Allah! Open my heart (for knowledge)
- Sit as close to the teacher as possible
- Make personal notes of each subject in your notebook
- Revise your notes everyday
- Don’t hesitate to ask questions from the teacher
- Don’t talk with your friends while the teacher is teaching (unless the teacher tells you to talk)
- Respect the teacher from your heart

Q12: I want to get a house in Paradise. How can I get it?

A: Say Surah Ikhlāas (قل هو الله احد – الله الصمد – لم يلد – ولم يولد – ولم يكن له كفوا احد) ten times. Allah Taala will build a huge house in Paradise inshaAllah for you.
