# Round of 32 Begins

Opening Round Games Have Some Interesting Matchups

et the games begin!
This week, the Round
of 32 will be played at
the 4A, 3A and 2A levels.
(The 1A will have a 24-team
field.)

This round will be a loser-out affair with the winners being reseeded by the WIAA and their committees for the opening of the 16-team state tournament.

It is very important the winners do well as the new pairings are announced next Sunday.

The top 6-8 teams are expected to do well, but from there, it could be dicey.

One of the most intriguing matchups is this Friday when **East Valley** of Yakima travels to take on **North Kitsap**.

The Red Devils tied for second in the CWAC (with Prosser) but lost their head-to-head matchup with the Mustangs 36-35.

East Valley is led by QB **Jaxon Berg** (Jr.) who threw for 1,452 yards (18.4 yards per completion) for 18 TD's.

His top target was sprinter **Greyson Stevens** (Jr.) who garnered 36 receptions for a 22.5 yard average and 11 TD.



**Drew Macdonald** of Steilacoom and Jacob Rainer of Prosser will light up the sky this Friday at 6PM.

Cody Gasseling (Jr.) was a dual threat with 356 yards rushing, six TD, 8.3 average. As a receiver, the 6-foot-3 210 player averaged 27.2 yards per reception.

Junior running back, Braden Albrecht had 988 yards on the ground with a 6.7 yard average. (Against Prosser, he ran for 227 yards on 37 carries.)

The Vikings (see more on the next page) finished strong winning five of their last six games. They were in a 3-way tie for the Olympic League championship. Other intriguing matchups include Steilacoom (6-3) at Prosser (6-3).

The Sentinels lost to Fife during week 9 on a last-second field goal. The win propelled the Trojans into third and Stelly wound up fourth in the SPSL.

The Mustangs rebounded after an 0-2 start to win six of their last seven games. Senior quarterback, **Jacob Rainier** was 30-of-33 passing last week in a 48-21 win over Selah.

Steilacoom also can toss the ball around. Senior **Drew Macdonald** is a dual-threat passing threat (like Rainer) throwing for 1,797 yards and rushing for 397.

Cedarcrest (the KingCo top seed) was 5-3 this year and unbeaten against 2A competition. They travel to the GSHL champion Woodland (7-2).

The Beavers beat Ridgefield last week for the GSHL title, 14-7 on a very wet field, (pouring rain).

Bainbridge (7-2) travels to Clarkston (6-3), Fife (6-3) is at Ridgefield (8-1) and Chief Sealth (8-1) at Sehome (6-3). These should all be coin-flip games. ◆

The new Round of 32 football playoffs have given many programs hope even after a slow start.

North Kitsap began the year 0-2 which included losses to highly-rated WF West (40-7) and 1A power, Lynden Christian (26-15). Factoring in the losses for the Vikings was the loss of 10-11 starters due to injury, etc.

In week 3, they lost to Oly League rival, Olympic 27-12 and it began to look like a lost year.

The coaching staff simplified things, worked harder on fundamentals and coached their young, inexperienced players up.

What followed were five wins in their next six games. Included was dealing Bainbridge (7-2) their first league loss, 14-7.

Their only loss during the streak was to playoffbound, 3A Oak Harbor, 20-17. The lone loss to Olympic put North Kitsap into a three-way tie for first place and all three teams advanced to the Round of

North Kitsap was helped by the return of their original starters and this week, coach Jeff Weible's crew hosts East Valley of Yakima. The contest promises to be one of the best matchups this weekend.

Nobody could have predicted that outcome, especially after the 0-3 start.

 Bainbridge, meanwhile had to deal with adversity of their own.

The former 3A school, whose only other loss was to Tumwater (56-6), lost their standout quarterback in the game against North Kitsap.

The loss of senior, Jack **Grant**, a two sport standout (baseball/football) was expected to cripple the Spartans' offense.

However, sophomore, Nate Pullman, threw for 247 yards and 5 TD's in his first start against Sequim (48-7 win.).

Last week, Pullman directed Bainbridge to a 43-13 win over Auburn -Mountainview. He threw for 239 yards while adding 3 more TD passes.

• Ephrata's loss to Toppenish (15-6) in week seven eventually cost them a chance to defend their league title.

But, their loss in week nine against Grandview (39-13) had no bearing because of the wins by East Valley and Prosser.

But, if they had beaten the Wildcats in week 7, they might have had a different outcome against Grandview.

The Tigers lost standout lineman, Coleman Cobb for the season before they met Toppenish and 6-foot-3 standout quarterback, **Brady Hendrick** also didn't play.

The junior standout returned the following week and Ephrata rolled over Selah 34-13.

· To underscore how important a quarterback can be, look no further than Woodland.

Last year, the Beavers made news by failing their levy which resulted in several major sports cuts.

Included was travel to their games. Parents had to ferry the players until their state playoff game at Clarkston in which a huge fund raiser gave them a luxury bus.

The major reason for their success this year has been RB-turned-QB, Elijah Anderson. He had 124 vards rushing and 10 solo tackles in Woodland's 14-7 victory over unbeaten Ridgefield.

In two years, the 6-foot-3 senior has over 2,500 yards rushing and scored 41 touchdowns. •
