





A 50 HANDGUN

Noteen has come out with a .50 BMG handgun.

I am working on getting one of these to do a full review in a future edition of VHP. Have a look here https://onlylongrange.com/ulr-50-bmg-mini-rifle/

Meanwhile, two shooters have already gone to the range with one.

Brandon Herrera, the AK guy, shoots one with a folding wire stock and a chainsaw front grip. Brandon is the guy developing a .50 BMG on an AK47 platform. Yes, I am trying to get an interview with him. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0nbyhSfXH3g

This is a pretty reasonable use for a chainsaw grip. I have several grips as a novelty item for sale in my shop. They do not mount well on a pump shotgun; not enough barrel clearance to be useful.

Scott DeShields, who you met in a previous issue of VHP, takes one to the range with just the standard rear grip and front pistol grip. Scott is the same guy whose RN 50 blew up on him. So you can understand his body armor.

Things I noticed from the start:

This appears to be a pistol. It is not. Noteen says the barrel is 16.5 inches long, which makes it a rifle. So the folding stock, forward grips, et al are OK. You do not need an SBR permit for this gun, unless you shorten the barrel even more.

Recoil has got to be substantial. Brandon hip shot his. That wire frame on a shoulder - nope. Not me. I will have plenty of extra padding when I drop a hammer on this one.

Does a .50 BMG handgun even exist? Yes.

Birdman, a YouTuber from the early days, did a satire video with a .50 BMG handgun.

As best I know, this was a one-off. I remember reading about it years ago, but my memory has gone the way of my original right knee. It left and isn't coming back.

When I bought Ragnarok from Larry Watson those years ago, we talked about .50 pistols. Hollywood approached Larry to make a .50 BMG pistol for a movie, but he said no.

At the time, he said if the ATF became "aware" of a certain number of handguns made in a specific caliber, the rules at the time meant AP ammo was then banned. Larry did not want to create something that could lead to .50 AP ammo being banned.

Of course, if you have any AP ammo for any firearm, I suggest you hang on to it.

50 BMG News Roundup

awaii is the next state to get on the Ban The 50 bandwagon.

KHON2 news out of Honolulu reports:

Local legislators said Hawaii's gun laws are among the strictest in the nation, but they are hoping to crack down even more.

Officials hope to make the largest round of ammunition that is generally available to Americans illegal in Hawaii.

Sen. Karl Rhoads said .50 caliber bullets and the guns that fire them have no place in civilian life.

"It's a sniper rifle. It can kill a person from, I don't know, a mile and a half away. They're too heavy to use for hunting," Sen. Rhoads said.

Sen. Rhoads, like so many politicians, does not let facts and reality get in the way of his political decision-making. As discussed in a recent issue of VHP, .50 BMG guns are almost never actually used in crimes. The guns show up in crime reports almost always as "in possession of." That means the criminal had one of the guns but as best law enforcement knows, never used it to actually commit a crime.

Criminals prefer guns that are easy to carry, easy to shoot and have cheap ammo. The .50 BMG fits none of those categories.

"They're generally handguns, like they are across the country, and they're acquired illegally by people that usually have criminal backgrounds and records and shouldn't be able to get them anyway," said Hawaii Rifle Association president Kainoa Kaku. "So, what does this accomplish, really? It's just another law, like all gun laws. They only affect law abiding citizens." Where long-range shooting and "sniper rifles" are concerned, it is equally obvious Sen. Rhoads does not understand what he is talking about. Just look at King of 2 Miles. Several other calibers are capable of reaching the same distances as a .50 BMG and do it accurately.

California, Illinois, New Jersey and the District of Columbia have .50 bans in place.

A LIGHTER MA DEUCE

The Browning .50 BMG M2, the Ma Deuce, is a war legend.

The Marines are looking for a way to lighten the load for this iconic firearm.

Marine Corps Systems Command asked ammo makers if they can turn out cartridges 24%-30% lighter than what Marines currently carry. This is not a formal request for bids. It is just a request for information so the Marines can decide if they need to move forward.

"The idea is that lighter ammo would make Marines quicker and more agile, traits "critical to battlefield survivability," Systems Command spokeswoman

Morgan Blackstock told Marine Corps Times.

2 cans of .50 ammo weigh about 77 pounds. The Corps is looking at a 100-round belt weighing 20.3 pounds to 22.3 pounds. That cuts the weight by one-quarter to nearly one-third.

If you have ever hauled anything on a long hike, you understand that even ounces matter. The Marines have looked at other ways to reduce the load, including changing body armor.

Otherwise, media reports offer conflicting statements about the future of the Ma Deuce. U.S. Ordnance of McCarran, Nevada, got a \$16,364,451 military contract Ma Deuces at the end of October.

The Washington Examiner, a very conservative news outlet with a low-reliability rating by media watchers, says the military is looking to replace the M2 with lighter guns.

A deeper read of that story shows the WE took

other news reports about getting lighter .50 ammo and turned that into a story about replacing John Moses Browning's big gun.

TESLA NOT TOUGH ENOUGH

The Tesla electric truck has a stainless steel body that is reported to be bullet proof. Indeed, the body panels will stand up to light rounds like the .45 ACP, 9mm and other low-power rounds.

The panels were not able to stop rifle rounds. And just because, JerryRigEverything also pulled out a .50 BMG and shot holes through the truck.





I very much enjoyed the article by Craig Martin on "The Historical Future of the 50 BMG". I was, however, looking for but did not find what I believe is a key topic concerning the popularity of the 50 BMG.

When I built my McMillan based 50 caliber rifle, I was challenged to select a chamber design that would support a broader range of uses. It seemed to me then, and I assume it is still true now, that I was forced to choose between an optimized long range competition chamber, and a more general use chamber that would fire conventional ammunition. I chose one that would

fire the broader range of ammunition but also discovered that it would not perform well at all with the best modern 50 caliber accuracy projectiles. As a result, I have not participated in any 50 BMG matches even though I am a long time and very serious marksmanship competitor with other classes of rifles.

I would like to see an article that addresses this issue and suggests possible changes to weapons, ammunition and/or competition rules to make 50 caliber competition more inviting to new shooters.



ROY'S Gun

nd in dis co'nuh weighing in at more than 500 pounds..."

When it comes to the unlimited class, one gun certainly holds the weight record. FCSA President Roy Thompson is the current owner of this behemoth, but he is not the original owner. For that matter, he is not even the person for whom the gun was built.

Roy insisted John get the credit for the gun.

John Buhay, a now retired .50 BMG and extreme long range shooter, is the man behind the unique gun that really does weigh more than 500 pounds. Just

the aluminum plate on the bottom is more than 100 pounds.

"The first time I took it to Raton, it won group and score for unlimited. Roy saw out there, when I put it up for sale he wanted it right away," John said. "Some say a lot of people build unlimited guns and they do not shoot. That one does. It always shot good."

"He did a masterpiece. That is a work of art," Roy said.

This winter, Roy rebarreled the monster as his groups were starting to spread.

"I just got done rebarreling it. The barrel had 3,000 rounds and it was wearing out. It went a long way. It was still winning, but it went from shooting 3-4 inch groups to 5, 6, 8, 10 inch groups," (()) said. "It was built to be a real tack driver."

SCREAMERS

Speaking of tacks, the gun has shot its fair share of screamers. Bluhay recalls the day he and his gunsmith took it to the range for the first time. "Very first time I shot it, the first 4 shots were in one spot. The last one dropped 4 inches," he said.

Before the last shot, the gunsmith said," I don't believe it. You are going to break the world record," Bluhay recalls. Did that jinx it? Maybe. "We shouldn't have talked about it," he added with a chuckle.

The gun continued to turn in stellar performances in the time since. Roy has won plenty of matches with it as well.

"I won 3 world championships with it. The last 3 in a row to be exact," he said.

John has records of 4 shots being about 3/4s of an inch apart. One flier, if you can really call it that, stretched the group to 2.313 inches.

HEAD TURNER

The gun is certainly a head turned when Roy backs the trailer up to the range. It moves from the trailer to the range and back on a custom table with a hydraulic lift to get it to shooting table height.

"It is a gun people really like," Roy says. "People come and try to beat it. Others go to the other classes."

Given the weight, more than 2 grown men, the gun has to go into the FCSA unlimited class. Still, a few shooters get a bit itked when it rolls up to the range. FCSA rules say unlimited only has 1 restriction: the gun has to shoot the .50 BMG bullet.

"I wish more people would build more of this kind of thing. It's kind of like top fuel drag racing," Roy said.

TECH

The technicals on the gun come from John.

John says it is a "stretch barrel gun." The barrel is housed inside a tube.

"There is a system to put tension on the barrel. It keeps the barrel from vibrating and there are no harmonics when you do that." Beating harmonics in a barrel is an issue all long-range shooters work on.

The gun is also water cooled, sort of. The resevoir holds antifreeze. As Johns says, the barrel never gets hot. Hot barrels are less accurate.

The front rails are above the center line of the gun. This means the recoil pushes the gun back instead of lifting it up. "I built a lot of guns in my day (he used

to work for US Armament and built more than 300 Gatling guns). The design of that one is strictly mine. I did everything," he said. "I did all the work on that gun on a manual bridgeport and a manual lathe. Took me about a year and a half of spare time to build that thing. I was trying to get it built for the kid who wanted it. I made him pay me for materials when I made it. He never could pay me for the labor. I paid him back for the materials."

John says the price to build one of the guns today is easily over \$10,000, if it could be made. Beyond that, he's not sure of the cost. "I don't know if they will make an action like that any more. The action was over 3,500 on that gun," he said.

It has a pnuematic trigger. Rather than pull a trigger, Roy (or whoever shoots it and I hope I get to this summer) pushes a button. That trips the firing mechanism and takes a bit of human element out of the firing sequence.

Years ago John got the idea to make the gun from other 1,000 yard benchrest shooters. He incorporated parts of those guns into the build and brought his own ideas to the table as well.

"I built the gun with no blueprints. I had an idea of what I wanted to do," he said from his Pennsylvania home. "I built it. I had it for probably 5-6 years before Roy got it." At that, it was not a gun he intended for himself. "I originally built it for another guy who wanted a .50, but he couldn't afford it when it was finished, so I kept it."

The expected original owner paid Bluhay for the materials as construction moved along. When the gun was done, the labor costs were more than the shooter could afford. John reimbursed the gent for the materials and kept it.

The scope is also offset. That is intentional. "It's about 4 inches to the left," John said. "That is so you can get in the gun while sitting beside it."

Some people may wonder how the offset scope affects performance. It doesn't, as evidenced by the records the gun holds. Besides which, the scope placement "doesn't matter," as John says. "It's always at 1,000 yards. You make sure the crosshairs are lined up where it impacts. It makes no difference at all. Besides, it's not offset that much, about 4 inches to the left."

RETIRED

At the time of the VHP interview, John was just returned from a 2-week stay at his hunt camp which is 16 miles from the nearest utility pole and, at the time, snow-covered. He retired from the .50 BMG world because of retina damage from shooting big guns. His collection went back to his gunsmith, who built those rifles for just the cost of parts.

He has also retired from gun making.
