





Mishap at Raton

The purpose of this note is to prevent the same mishap to others. During the World Shot I experienced two hang fires. I was fortunate that there was only a very short delay before the rifle

After arriving home, I dismantled my rifle bolt & found the firing pin spring was covered with a heavy white coating. (This coating was only visible on the spring - not anywhere else on the bolt). The only account for this coating is the use of spray gun cleaner used during my regular rifle cleaning. As to the type of spray gun cleaner, I use several brands -no help there. Oh & I checked my son's rifle and found the same exact white coating & he uses a different brand.

I will not be using ANY brand of spray gun cleaner after this. To remove this white coating I found that Hoppies & a brass pasts brash worked the best.

d George, thank you, thank you, thank you.

Ed helped (coached) me to the finish line at the WC in Raton. Using his gun and ammo he loaded and as importantly, applying his advice, I shot 2 sub-MOA groups and brought home the Rookie of the Year award. In the sight-in period popping paper plates at 1,040 yards (more or less) I dropped 2 on the plate with my 4th shot snapping the stick holding the plate up.

I cannot tell you which I am most excited about. Shooting at the paper plate, I mumbled to myself that I wanted to shoot the stick in two. The first 2 shots at the

plate went wide. Ed said that would probably happen. I was still close and very happy. Shot 3 was about 8:30 (a.m. or p.m.? Need someone to explain that one to me). 4th shot and, and the plate slowly fell to the left. The only thing that kept me jumping up and down in excitement was the knowledge my knee (replaced in February) would not tolerate such antics. The Baker Shuffle, generally seen at high school football games, came out. The Baker Shuffle was demonstrated a few more times on the range over the weekend.

My award, the plate, score sheets and patches are part of a display hanging in my office. They have a place of honor next to the display about me suing the City Council here and winning. (Contact me privately for details if you want 'em.)

Shirley List walked up one time, a big grin on her face, to see how I'd shot. She saw the Baker Shuffle and figured I'd done well.

In the matches, I leaned on Ed. He gave me solid advice on holdovers to combat the wind and it worked. One time I was actually holding on the 7 ring and had impacts on the left side of the 10 ring. During the matches, I had to make adjustments between scoring rounds for the wind. That is old hat to a lot of you veterans. Not me. My longest shot (excepting the single round fired from Martin List's gun last year) is about 350 yards at a deer, which I missed. Later learned my scope was badly off. I know a little about holdovers from shooting .22 LR out to 100 yards or more.

Ed told me he learned so much from other shooters and was only passing info along.

That is what makes the FCSA so great. We come together and share. Helping each other is the bedrock rule of this association. It should be the way we live our daily lives too. Years ago when I first joined, I made Raton a bucket list trip. That happened last year; I did not shoot as I wanted to learn what was going on. About the bylaws revisions

FCSA members

The final version of your updated FCSA Competition

Rules and Bylaws for 2024 is done. They will be on the website. These were finalized and proofed by myself and the printer in Wisconsin. (The same folks who do the Very High Power magazine).

I want to start by making you aware that correcting and updating these documents has been a very difficult process. I'm not complaining, but I want to let you all know that updating your rules & bylaws needs to be done regularly. What had happened was, there have not been any of the little

books we all used to carry whenever going to a match, printed since 2019. The rules & bylaws had not been modified since 2014. The only place I could go to get a copy of the rules & bylaws was our website and I ended up printing a complete set from our website.

When trying to make the changes that Roy asked me to update. I found that I was not able to change the ones I printed off the website. I believe (not positive) that was because our website version had been changed, modified or updated in a piecemeal manner over 15-20 years. The problem was solved when I contacted Martin & Shirley List who were able to mail me their copy of the last printing of the bylaws in 2019.

My recommendation to the E. Board is, try to get our Rules & Bylaws updated on the FCSA website annually. I'm not much of a 'techy' kind of guy, but I'm sure Brett can work that out. I do recommend that a copy of this document be sent to Brett and ask him to reprint the entire set of Rules & Bylaws that I am sending to y'all onto the FCSA website.

Please file these copies in a safe spot on your computer systems to ensure we (FCSA) have good records of the changes we make to our Rules & Bylaws. I'm sure Roxanne will store these properly, but the more 'Club Officers' who have legitimate copies, the better off you will be. I also recommend these be sent to the entire Board of Directors for the same reasons.

Our updated rules & bylaws were sent forward yesterday for printing. They should be finished by the end of next week. We have requested 200 copies and my last estimate for cost is \$3.00 per copy which will cost FCSA \$600.00. I suspect that distributing these books to the shooters in FCSA will be a priority. My recommendation would be one copy per household just to keep costs down.

I asked the printer to send me 8 copies of the books and asked him to bill me for shipping & cost of those books.



FCSA will receive 192 copies of the books. My books are for several good friends in FCSA and I will communicate with Roxanne so that we don't duplicate our efforts here.

I'm going to go off subject a little bit here.

My wife Teri & I joined FCSA in 1989 and competed all over the United States for about 25 years before I had to quit shooting. It was our sport and we both enjoyed it very much. I have thousands of photos I've taken over the years on my computer and I visit those

memories regularly. During the time Teri & I competed with FCSA we always made ourselves available to help the FCSA in any way possible. Teri & I have served several terms as a Board members, she served 4 years as Secretary/Treasurer, one term as President of FCSA and has contributed many articles for publication in the VHP. My time was similar including being the original author of the FCSA Bylaws and the FCSA Rules of Competition. I've been Chairman of every committee FCSA has and I founded the Fifty Caliber Institute (FCI) and served as President of FCI for 13 years. During this time, Teri & I have never taken any compensation for any activities we participated in with FCSA. I'm not shy about asking everyone else to do just that. FCSA needs your help and efforts right now to get back up and running the way it should be. The exception to this would be the job as Secretary or Treasurer. Those are full time jobs.

FCSA is caught up in a crossroads right now. The shooting community is highly motivated with the ELR shooting community and this has caused FCSA to lose a lot of members. However, it's also obvious the sport of competing at 1,000 yds, is still a very viable and interesting sport. This club is worth the efforts of all of us.

I've never met Roy Thompson. I knew Craig Martin as a very legitimate competitor my last few years of shooting and I enjoyed his company. Over the past few months I've spoken with Roy several times and I find him to be a very capable leader for this club. His heart & efforts are in the right place. Please give Roy & Craig all the help we can. Just sayin...



Team Martin takes top honors in Raton

Craig Martin took home another world championship title from the 2024 WC at Raton, NM. Dianne pulled targets for him again, making the trophy a team win.

Martin competed in the Iron Man, meaning he shot in the 4-gun aggregate part of the competition. He turned in 30 X-rings, more than twice that of the 2nd place Iron Man shooter Scott Kierstead, with 12.

Richard Biggio posted 19 Xs, but his scores, overall, sat him in 4th place.

Martin also logged in a 1,155 overall score and a combo of 13,260. Kierstead, in 2nd, posted 1,094 and 19,620.

Martin was also in the lead in most of the individual categories. He was part of the South Central shooters 4-man team that took top honors in this category. He was in second for the team, behind William Breda with a 12,958. Martin posted 14,823.

In the final totals for Heavy Gun, Martin was 7th with a 286 and 6 Xs. Richard Biggio was the lead with a 290 and 5 Xs. Marlene Hamilton posted the best Heavy group with 7.563.

In Unlimited, Martin was on top with 292 and 10xs. His best group, 9.813 was 3rd as Richard Biggio again proved to be the man to beat with an 8.760.

Posting a 290, 8 in the X ring was good enough for 1st in the Hunter category for Martin, His 12.073 best group was 3rd, behind Pat Billotte with a 10.708 in 1st and Randy Powell with 11.719 in second.

Combining Heavy and Unlimited, Martin was in the lead with a combo of 12.240, 16 Xs, a score of 578 and a 10.406

SCREAMERS & YELLERS

38 Screamers, groups of less than 7 inches, were turned in. Scott Kierstead posted an amazing 2.938 best group. That is not a world record, but it beat several previous world records.

As Craig Martin noted more than once in Raton, the .50 BMG can, does and will hold its own in 1,000-yard an Extreme Long Range shooting. Martin and Kierstead proved that over and over in Raton and likely will continue to prove it where the best long-range and extreme long range shooters gather.

Brett Berger, the FCSA webmaster and lead photographer, rounded out the list with a 6.938 group for .662 MOA.

On the Yeller side, 7 inches to 1 MOA, 141 patches are going out to a bunch of shooters.

Michael Whitesides and Barry Hamilton both turned in a perfect 7.000. Whitesides edged into 1st with 4 in the X ring and a score of 49. He shot heavy, Hamilton shot light.

On the far end, 3 shooters turned in 997 MOA or 10.438. They are Ed George, Martin and Baker.

CATEGORIES

The FCSA also groups shooters by categories.

New FCSA Secretary Roxanne Myers took home the Iron Maiden trophy with 17 Xs, a 1,047 score and a combo of 22,453. In the Ladies' overall competition, Marlene Hamilton









was the shooter to beat with 11.063 in heavy gun.

The Senior Champ title this year went to Michael Whitesides, who shot a heavy gun for an 11.115 combo.

Three juniors were on the line this year. Aubree Bowman had a combo of 52.954, a 206 score and 1 in the X for a group of 39.927.

4 rookies took to the line this year, with VHP Editor Ben Baker (see Editor's Bench for more details) taking home 1st with a 6.594 score in the Unlimited class. Other rookies were Jay Dvorsky, Jerry Behrens and Amy Behrens.

On the International side, Accuracy International cofounder Dave Walls shot 17.594 in Unlimited to take home the top slot.

THE SHOOT

Shooting at the NRA Whittington Center means you never know what to expect until you get on the range and start burning powder.

This year stayed dry but wind was definitely a factor. At times the wind socks were straight down. At times they were 45 degrees on parts of the range and dead down on other parts, at the same time. Winds also switched around, leading shooters to make adjustments with each series of shots.

As much fun as sending chunks of lead and copper downtange is, the best part of the annual shoot is seeing old friends, making new friends and generally having a great time.

If you did not make it in 2024, plan to be there in 2025.


Jeannette thanks for all you do for the FCSA. It is much appreciated.

first match was not to keep everything on paper but rather to not mess up the match for someone else and get run off. As at this match, even experienced shooters make mistakes. Some shooters try different loads or set ups and sometimes they work and sometimes they don't. But we all have fun, learn and move on.

I should mention for those that may not be aware that when you put a shoot off paper they add 36" to you group size and my group for the target I crossfired was 40 3/4" which means the other four shoots where in a 4 34" and the puller on Brett's target said the shot that he thought was the crossfire would have been in the middle of my group in the nine ring (two shots came through at the same time, one in the middle of Brett's group the other where my group was on my target). That would have lowered my agg in Unlimited by 6". It would have made a difference I my Two-Gun agg of 3.75". It goes to show every shot counts. Oh well, Guess I need to be more careful to make sure I'm on my target next time. I hope this doesn't sound like I am complaining, far from it because I was really pleased with how I shot. I mention this to stress we all make mistakes. Don't be afraid to come and make some with us. I hope to be seeing you all at a match soon.







Michael Whitesides had a perfect 5.000 and a 37 for fhe second best screamers of the match. He had none in the X.






