ANNOUNCEMENT TO CUSTOMERS: CHANGE OF SERVICE

Attn: Residents

Effective Sept to April pickup will be changed to Saturdays at 9am. **The last Wednesday pickup will be September 18th – The First Saturday pickup will be Sept 21st.**

Please note what gets picked up

Just a few guidelines on what can be Recycled and what can be garbage.

- **Recyclables must be in a clear plastic bag supplied by the Hamlet (Available at the rink).**
- See page 2 for Recycling Guidelines
- **All cardboard** must be flattened and then either bagged in clear plastic, stretch wrapped in a bundle, or taped in a bundle. **Any cardboard that is not flattened or bundled will not be accepted.**
- **Maximum size of cardboard is 24" x 36" (because of recycle bin size) If larger please cut to this size.**
- All garbage must be in **tied bags** of reasonable size and weight. (If bags are overfilled they tear when being picked up, it will be the responsibility of the home owner to clean this up.
- Max weight of bags is 25lbs. Overweight bags will not be picked up.
- **Maximum number of bags per house hold is 5 (Recyclables and garbage combined)**
- Garbage will not be picked up if thrown loosely in a bin.
- **No Construction material, scrap metal, tires, concrete, sofas, mattress, grass clippings, tree trimmings, garden refuse, or straw, will be picked up.**
- **Compost is not recyclable or Garbage;** please consider using a compost bin, to reduce waste.
- There are lots of items that can be recycled, however, cannot be processed by us. Divert these items to other recycling facilities! The Saskatchewan Waste Reduction Council (SWRC) site has a search engine so you can look up information on divertible waste materials. RECYCLING GUIDELINES

(What is allowed in the single-stream recycling carts)

CARDBOARD & BOXBOARD

Ex: Flattened cardboard, cereal boxes, paper egg cartons, milk & juice cartons



MIXED PAPER

Ex: Newspapers, office paper, fliers, & shredded paper (in clear plastic bag)



PLASTICS #1 to #7

Ex: Pop bottles, milk jugs, soap bottles, rinsed food & drink containers (juice, yogurt, etc.)



HOUSEHOLD TIN & ALUMINUM

Ex: Aluminum containers & foil, tin cans, & aluminum beverage cans



HELPFUL RECYCLING TIPS:

- * Rinse out all food & drink items
- * Flatten cardboard boxes
- * Remove lids/caps from bottles
- * No plastic bags of any kind, including "crinkly" or "stretchy" plastics
- * Place all items loose in the cart; except shredded paper
- * Plastics must have a #1 to #7 recycle symbol on the bottom
