# From the President Sally Seidl

#### Hi Everyone,

Usually when I write these articles, I write and re-write them several times so they make sense and offer up something worth your reading. I use a writing format that I learned in college. Tonight, I'm going to write this from my heart, without worrying about format, etc. Tonight I'd like to scream "What's wrong with us as a people? What's wrong with us as a nation, as a community, as a church? Where is our compassion? Where is the love that Jesus instructed us to share?" The Bible tells us that a house divided cannot stand. Well, we are divided as a nation, a community and as a church. As Christians, I think, we need to do some self reflection and think about God's reaction to what we are up to. Is He smiling or crying?

For the last two weeks I was sicker than a dog. My covid test was negative, but Bellin's employee health nurses kept reminding me that 30% of negative covid tests are false. While in quarantine, I saw quite a bit of news on TV. I watched as a crowd of angry insurgents stormed the Capitol of the United States. I watched as police officers were beaten with flags, pipes, hockey sticks among other things. Five people died. Rioters chanted "Hang Mike Pence!!!", "Where's Nancy?" They urinated and defecated on the walls and floor. They ransacked offices and destroyed property. They had guns, bear spray and zip ties. They put our democracy at risk and all the members of Congress and their staff at risk. Now some people want to move on as if it never happened. They want unity instead of accountability. What about the trauma experienced by the people that hid under tables, in closets, that hid period? What about the trauma family and friends experienced? What about our future as a democracy? What is wrong with us as a nation? Where is our compassion?

My neighbor is immune compromised, and yet her relative refuses to wear a mask when visiting. A nurse, that I went to nursing school with, rants and raves about having to wear a mask, because she has the right not to wear one. What about the rights of others not to be exposed to Covid? She's a nurse and a Christian, yet she is not willing to protect her fellow man! Two CNA's and an RN go out drinking every morning after work. They don't wear masks in the bar, nor do they wear masks at work, despite working in healthcare and being reprimanded by superiors. One came down with Covid and infected 11 out of 13 night staff and their families plus those families' coworkers, classmates and teachers. A young woman with little kids can't have emergency surgery, because she tested positive for Covid. Her kids are scared to death that she's going to die. And still people don't want to wear a mask. A doctor was notified that his patient was receiving too many IV fluids and too much medication for his size. The man was homeless and had no family.

The nurse, who advocated for him, was told to do nothing and let it be day shift's problem. A nurse with 30 yrs of psych experience decides psych nursing is a waste. People should just buck, up and deal with their problems. Really? People with histories of physical, emotional and sexual abuse should just buck up? Really? People with medical diagnoses of depression, bipolar, psychosis should not get treatment? Why? "Because those black people (or poor people) just game the system." What is wrong with us as a community? Where is our compassion?

Churches are divided over whether or not they should do in-church services. Imagine the position that places the priest, pastor or rabbi in. Who does he or she listen to? The entire church is his/her responsibility. His/her health is put at risk. I was told recently by a Christian friend that I'm not a good Christian, because I don't think churches should be open for in-church services. The scientific and medical experts are saying the months ahead will be the worse ever. I'm a nurse, of course I'm going to listen to and follow the science. Yes, I'd love to be in church, but I've seen the deadly effects of Covid. I know people who have died of it. I've had friends that were so sick they couldn't even turn themselves over in bed. I've seen the delayed effects of Covid – loss of hearing, lingering fatigue, damaged lungs. I'm tired of people dismissing the seriousness of the disease. I'm tired of being told that if I really trusted in God, I wouldn't have a problem going into church. God gave us brilliant men and women, who have advised us on how to protect ourselves and others in this pandemic. He gave us science, and we need to listen to His experts. Do we really want to put others at risk of getting a deadly infectious disease like Covid? He gave us technology so we can safely worship in the parking lot or at home. What is wrong with us as a church? Where's our compassion?

Is God smiling or crying? What does he expect us to do? Do we stay divided or do we try to find a way to come together? Do we think only of our wants and needs, or do we think of what's best for others? Please don't tell me I need to trust in God to handle the division in our world. I do trust in God, but I also believe He expects us to take action against the civil unrest in this country, the wrongs in our community and any division that arises in our church. I'm passionate about the things I've written about. You may not agree with me, but I do hope everyone will join me in doing some self reflection and will strive to put the safety of others first and foremost. Please, let's follow the science. Let's wear a mask, social distance, stay home, wash our hands, avoid congregating in social settings. (I wear a mask 8 hrs a day at work. You do get use to it and can even forget your are wearing it.)

#### February Greetings from the food pantry

We are thankful for the support that the pantry is seeing. Our January shipment of food from the Government exceeded our freezer capacity. We are thankful that Bethel Lutheran had some freezer capacity we could use for a couple of weeks. During January we were unexpectedly able to obtain an additional used upright freezer for the pantry. This makes 10 freezers now in use at the pantry. It is hard to imagine that we can distribute that much food each month. I am always amazed when just what we need becomes available just when we need it.

We continue to deliver food to the client's vehicles in the parking lot. We would like to be able to have more social interaction with them but for now we must proceed on the side of safety for the clients and the staff. The current process does make the distribution days a little more efficient but it feels like we are missing the fun part of the activity. I guess there is good and bad in everything.

For now we are thankful for the blessings that God sends to us. We have trained 5 new volunteers, and have seen the return of some who were off for a while. We are now getting closer to the goal of being able to have some time off for volunteers occasionally without slowing down the distribution. The volunteers are coming from Ascension Lutheran and the community at large as well as from Resurrection Lutheran.

Thank You for all the support we continue to receive for the pantry. We ask God to bless you generously.
