Resolution 2024-1

ASA SUPPORT FOR AUVSI DRONE PREPARED

WHEREAS, drone technology is critical for future economies and the national security; and,

WHEREAS, states, territories, Tribes have a significant role in establishing a marketplace that encourages safe drone operations and business development; and,

WHEREAS, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has established jurisdiction over the airspace while states/Tribes/territories have control over take-off and landing sites: and,

WHEREAS, drone policy adopted at the state/tribal/territory level should not impede the development of the drone industry or conflict with national airspace;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Aerospace States Association (ASA) supports the right of state/Tribes/territories to manage their drones in their jurisdiction understanding that the Federal Aviation Administration has sole airspace jurisdiction; and,

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the ASA encourages states/Tribes/territories to adopt legislation that would clarify jurisdiction roles and discourage localities from implementing drone requirements and policies that would create conflict with the FAA or state/tribal/territorial laws and regulations.

AND BE IT RESOLVED, that the ASA supports the adoption of the recommended legislation, Uncrewed Aircraft Systems Rights and Authorities, proposed by the AUVSI (Association for Uncrewed Vehicle Systems International).
