We often hear about the negative things our young people are engaged in, and rarely hear when positive achievements are realized. It is our responsibility to encourage, prod, and push them to exceed even their expectations, and at the same time remind them that greatness is on the other side of the road.

FROM THE HEART OF THE PASTOR.....

“They gave Moses this account: “We went into the land to which you sent us, and it does flow with milk and honey! Here is its fruit. But the people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large. We even saw descendants of Anak there. The Amalekites live in the Negev; the Hittites, Jebusites and Amorites live in the hill country; and the Canaanites live near the sea and along the Jordan. Then Caleb silenced the people before Moses and said, “We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it.” Numbers 13:27–30

As we worship today, our services are geared to the children who were a part of our 2021 Summer camp. I am convinced it is our responsibility to sow into our children seeds of faith, hope, and charity, which seems to be so elusive based upon today’s standards. Our children, our future seem to have been the forgotten generation where no one wants to assist in their development to become productive men and women. Based upon this scripture selected by our speaker today, there are many obstacles in life that are achievable, but you must have an attitude of excellence, and develop a mindset of whatever it is, “we can possess the land.”

It is astonishing that men so dastardly as these should have had courage enough to risk their persons in searching the land. But probably though destitute of valor they had a sufficiency of cunning, and this carried them through. The report they brought was exceedingly discouraging, and naturally tended to produce the effect mentioned in the next chapter. The conduct of Joshua and Caleb was alone magnanimous, and worthy of the cause in which they were embarked.

Now in chapter thirteen we get the story. Now, they come to Kadesh Barnea, and they are now on the border ready to enter into the Promised Land. They had been about two years, a little over two years now in the wilderness. And now they've come to the place of entering in and possessing the land that God had promised to them. In coming to the borders of the land, Moses thought it would be wise to send spies into the land in order that they might travel through the land, look at the cities, look at the crops; just sort of size up the land, the fortifications of the people and all and to come back and bring the report and bring back some fruit from the land.

And so they chose from each tribe one man to go in, and thus, there were twelve spies that entered into the land. And in the first part of the thirteenth chapter, it lists those that went in; two of them are important to us. Of the tribe of Judah, in verse six, Caleb, and then of the tribe of Ephraim, Oshea, in verse eight.

Someone must have mustard seed faith and believe that God is preparing more Joshua’s and Caleb’s to take the land.
