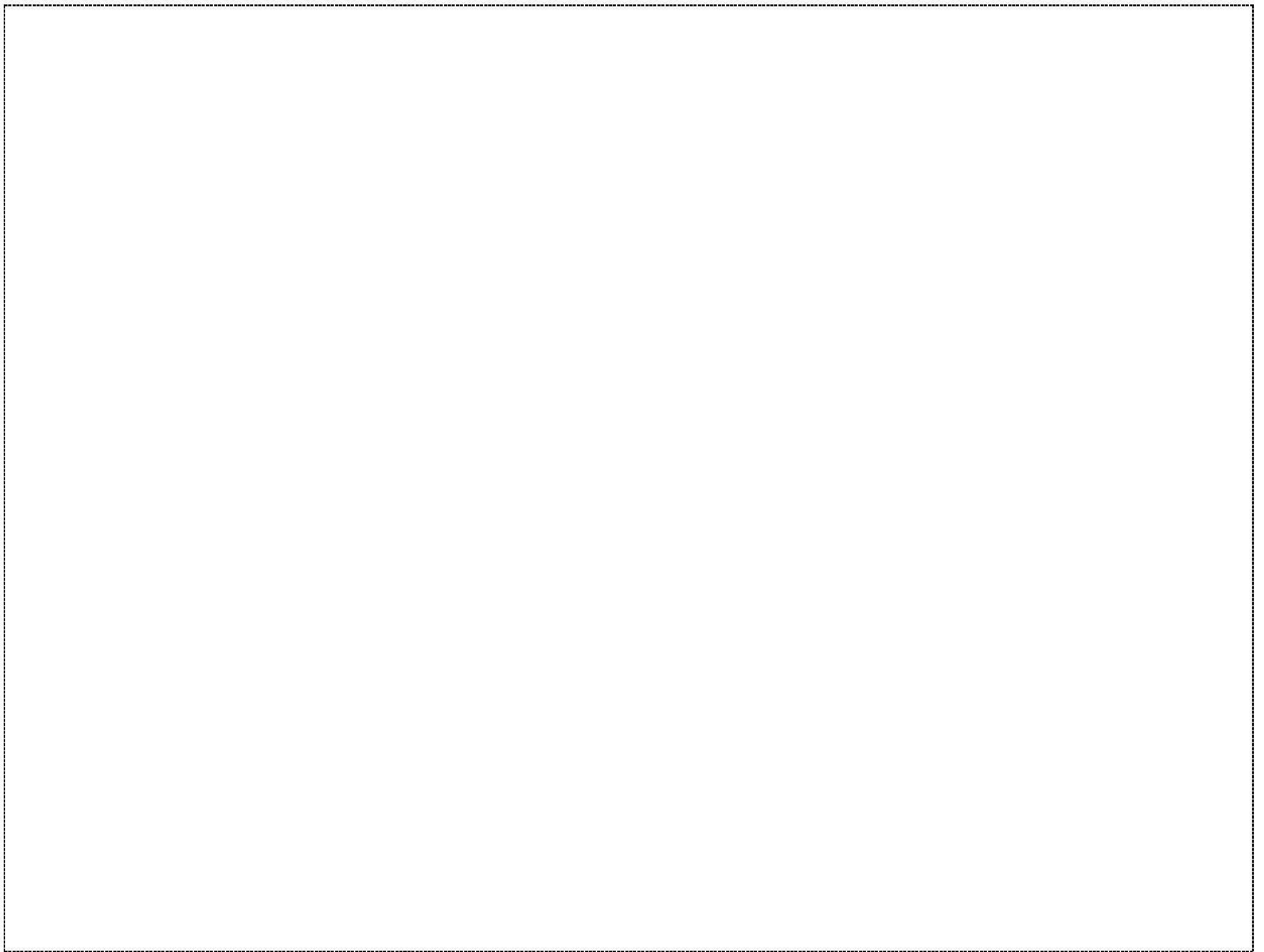

FROM THE HEART OF THE PASTOR.....

Oftentimes, we have a misunderstanding on interpretation of scriptures versus application. We will read a passage of scriptures and use it to badger someone based upon our personal interpretation, versus God's interpretation, therefore, we will use the wrong application, at the wrong time.

You see when we study the word of God we must understand there is a difference between interpretation and application of the Bible. To interpret the scripture, it tells you the purpose of what that passage means or what it says. You see I hate to burst some of your bubbles, or even rain on some of your parades, but absolutely no scripture, no scripture, is for private interpretation. As a matter of fact, every passage of scripture has a direct reason for being there and has an interpretation. God's word is not just there unless you're reading certain poetic books, but for the most part you are reading where there was dialogue, conversation, or something going on and there has to be an interpretation of what's happening going on.

Some of us even wrestle with the writers of the Bible stating things such as, "the Bible has been changed" "That is not the original version" But I am reminded what Paul told Timothy in 2 Timothy 3:16-17, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so

that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." But when you get through with the interpretations of the scriptures, there are many beautiful applications that can be applied to any situation. But I need to caution you because there is nothing wrong with using a scripture for an application process, but don't get it twisted, because your application, just might have nothing to do, with God's intended interpretation.

All Scripture is inspired by God. Inspired by God, not man. God chose to work through the agency of His people. Not a committee, not casting beads. There is a committee called the Jesus seminar. It is supposed to be full of scholars. They cast beads to determine which of the sayings of Jesus are authentic. Such foolishness. Inspiration is from God's heart and His mind to the writers. 1. "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks," (Matt. 12:34). Because it comes from God, it cannot be anything else except pure, accurate, truthful, and helpful.

So as we do here in Zion Hill, let's do the OIA, we observe, interpret, and apply. When we go that route, we can't go wrong.
