



Members all,

Merry Christmas everyone! I wish everyone a happy holiday season and a healthy and prosperous New Year. I would also like to use the end of 2023 to thank all of our staff and officers for all of their hard work this year.

The motto Elks care, Elks share applies yearround, but is especially appropriate during

the holiday season. To that end our Lodge is participating in two holiday campaigns – a toy drive for children and a food drive for veterans.

The Delray Beach Police Department working with the Delray Citizens for Delray Police are having their 33rd annual toy drive. They are requesting donations of new, unwrapped toys. There is a collection box in the front entryway of the Lodge. The box will remain there until December 13th, at which time it will be picked up by the DBPD. Last year they distributed approximately 2,000 toys to 1,000 children. For some of the children these toys were the only gifts that they received.

The West Palm Beach Veterans Administration Healthcare System is collecting non-perishable food items to assist veterans this holiday season. Specifically, our Lodge will be collecting for the VA Pantry located at the West Palm Beach VA Hospital. The needed non-perishable items include beef jerky, canned soup, peanut butter, spaghetti sauce, ketchup, mustard, snack bars, and macaroni and cheese. A collection box will be in the Lodge until December 20. Please support these causes if you can. There are a lot of people out there who could use our help.

"MESSAGE FROM YOUR ER"

An update on the building repairs - donations to the Building Repair Fund have tapered. Total donations are now \$19,424.64. None of these funds have yet been spent. Discussions with our mortgage holder to do a cash-out loan modification were halted after Grand Lodge said that they would not approve of our Lodge taking on any additional debt as our current cash flow will not support it. In fact, our cash flow barely covers our current debt. We can revisit this solution if/when our cash flow improves. Again, have a joyous and safe holiday!

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Yes, this is another story about how it's necessary for our members to volunteer at the Lodge. Why is it that the same SMALL group of volunteers, in some cases almost daily, are the only ones that seem to care about the Lodge? The officers and trustees not only volunteer to serve on the Board but they are also the same members that volunteer day after day. From participating in the Lodge Clean Up, Monday Night Dinners, Bingo, Queen of Hearts, House Committee, Activities Committee, Patio Grill, etc., it's always the same names that sign up to help.

Very few of the volunteer positions require any heavy physical labor. In fact, most do not require much physical labor at all. Areas in which volunteers are needed include the sale of raffle tickets, the serving of food (taking the dinner to tables or the bar) during Monday Night Dinner, helping to decorate the Lodge for various holidays or events, cooking at the Patio Grill or for Monday Night Dinner, or several other different activities. You can spend as much time as you wish as a volunteer.

At the conclusion of every initiation ceremony, the new members identify themselves and tell why they wanted to become an Elk. Universally, nearly everyone says they joined to help and to participate at the Lodge. Unfortunately, after the evening, they are seldom seen at the Lodge again. We have over 900 members and less than 10% of our members ever volunteer.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of the Lodge. Without volunteers, the Lodge could not hold many or, for that matter, any of our events and activities. Think about it...there are not many paid employees at the Lodge (one exception is the bartenders). Volunteers run almost everything at the Lodge. Without volunteers there would be no Lodge.

Please consider giving a little of your time to the Lodge. It will help the Lodge immensely and you will definitely find it to be fun and you will feel good about participating. It's easy...contact a bartender, obtain a volunteer slip, fill it out with your interests, and one of the volunteer coordinators will contact you.



WE DESPERATELY NEED YOUR HELP

It is not clear if the members know that the Lodge is hemorrhaging money on a monthly basis. If the current trend continues, the Lodge may not currently have sufficient income to cover the monthly expenses of the Lodge.

Just as you have experienced an astronomical increase in your home owner's insurance, the Lodge is no different. Insurance, electricity, employee costs, food costs, and liquor costs (to name a few) have all gone up.

The Lodge attempts to cover costs through liquor sales, food (Monday Night Dinner, Patio Grill, the Kitchen, etc.), raffles, rental of the Pineapple Ballroom, and other activities and events. Unfortunately, the Lodge has not recovered from the problems and reduction of usage of the Lodge caused by Covid. Many of our members have not returned to the Lodge since Covid. The Pineapple Ballroom has not been rented as often as it was before Covid. These issues have resulted in a shortfall in revenue needed to keep the Lodge viable.

It should be noted that the proceeds from Bingo and Queen of Hearts cannot be used for the operation of the Lodge. Those funds, due to Florida statute, must be used for charity and the Elks supports many charities. Also, money collected for the Building Repair Fund cannot be used for operating expenses. It is collected solely for facility repairs.

So, what are the solutions? Well, the Lodge could increase dues placing some of the burden on all members, whether you visit the Lodge or not. Another is to increase the price of liquor, beer and food. You would still find the liquor and beer prices less than what you would spend at other establishments. Another solution would be close one or two nights a week to save operating costs.

At the present, none of these solutions are being considered but without increased member participation at the Lodge, there may be no choice but to implement some, if not all, of them.


