We are NOT asking you to become a cook – just come help and they will find the best place for your talents. Contact Walter directly at: mellowb@comcast.net.

More specials will be added as volunteers help out, but right now, Carmelita's Burritos have gone over really well! We have been unable to purchase potato skins, so, we decided to make our own. Good Grief....we are now prepping about 12 servings at every shift. We sold more Potato Skins in one shift than we did during the past couple of months combined. Rumor has it that the best Potato Skins in Delray Beach are right here in our own kitchen. The Sausage and Pepper Grinders, Meatball Grinders and Chicken-Parmesan Grinders are catching up in popularity. The Patty Melt, Onion Rings, and Philly Cheesesteaks have also been a roaring success.

Recently, Minestrone and Pasta Faggioli soup were added and were well received but unfortunately, there have been supply issues. We keep a constant eye out for them every Wednesday when we shop. Fresh House Onion Soup is on its way. House Chicken Pot Pie and Shepherd's Pie are coming back as a special.

Fries now come with just about everything except burgers and hotdogs. You can add American, Cheddar Cheeses, Sautéed Onions, for \$1 each or Sauerkraut or Swiss, or Bacon for \$2. Our Hamburgers are now 81/19 Ground beef and made fresh. Chicken Wings are available whenever the kitchen is open but take note this dish takes 18 minutes to prepare.

The Guest Chef program held on Monday Evenings and special events such as Super Bowl and St. Patrick's Day have been very successful. We are limiting our service to about 50 dishes. We do not take reservations. First Come, First Served. Plan accordingly. When we run out, the kitchen closes.

We have created a weekly schedule that is being sent to everyone that we have an email address for. It will let you know in advance what is happening at the Lodge. Keep your eyes on your email and our webpage (www.delrayelks.org).

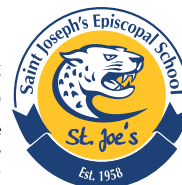
