ELKS POW / MIA TABLE – A MEMORIAL KEPT ALL YEAR

Note: Recently a group renting our Elk's Pineapple room decided to smash cupcakes into the table cloth of our POW table. 1770 lodge member Darlene Frey decided to take the soiled tablecloth home, washed it, and returned it making the table right again. *Thank you Darlene!*

We decided to remind everyone about the POW/MIA table.



You notice there is small table in the lobby of the Delray Elks Lodge – it is in a place of honor. It is set for one. This table is the Elks way of symbolizing that members of the Armed Forces are missing from our midst. They

are called POWs (Prisoners of War) and MIAs (Missing in Action).

They are unable to be with us at this time and so we remember them.

This table set for one is small – it symbolizes the frailty of one prisoner against their oppressors.

The tablecloth is white – it symbolizes the purity of their intentions to respond to our country's call to arms.

The single rose displayed in the vase reminds of their families and loved ones who keep faith in their return. The red ribbon tied so prominently around the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbons worn on the lapels and breasts of thousands who bear witness to their unyielding determination to demand a proper accounting of our missing heroes.

- A slice of lemon is on the dinner plate it reminds us of their bitter fate.
- There is salt on the bread plate is symbolic of the family's tears, as they wait.
- The glass is inverted they cannot toast with us tonight.
- The chair is empty they are not here.

Remember them for it is we who depended on their might and aid, and relied on them, for surely, they have not forsaken us. They are the heroes. A red rose (real for special events, silk for permanent display), is in the vase.

1. A red ribbon (tied at the base of the vase).

2. Slice of lemon (real for special events, silk or plastic for permanent display), on the dinner plate

- 3. A small pile of salt on the bread plate.
- 4. A nice looking water glass (inverted).

5. One chair ONLY (can be adorned with a POW/ MIA draping available from many sources).

6. Stands with red cordons, although not necessary, add an impressive touch of formality.

NOTE: Different color roses may be used, as follows:

RED: denotes passion and love. Most commonly used for the POW/MIA table.

YELLOW: denotes passing love (as in a romance, if the table is a personal one).

WHITE: denotes purity and new beginning.

VETERAN'S HONORED ON ST. PATRICK'S DAY

Conrad Ogletree reported that Delray Elks donated \$500 to Veterans & Homefront Voices which we used to help fund our efforts in the Delray St. Patrick's Day Parade and for the WWII 80th Anniversary Celebration we held at the Mizner Park Cultural Center on March 31. In the St. Patty photo there were 7 WWII veterans. We distributed the posters along the parade since with almost 40,000 spectators along the route this was as close to a Welcome Home parade most of the veterans who served during Korea or Vietnam eras ever got.





In the group photo from the WWII 80th there are 17 WWII veterans. We presented each WWII veteran with their own Legacy Plaque, a quilt from the Quilts of Valor Foundation, and a Thank You Note – signed by most of the event guests.



History between Lodge #1770 and Veterans & Homefront Voices goes back to last June 12 when the Lodge hosted the Women Veterans Day ceremony we presented with the Atlantic CHS Junior ROTC Brigade. There is a lot of story to tell to our members and to the community.
