NEW DATE FOR PA COMM

A move was started last month to reduce the number of meetings at which the Post Commander and the Post Finance Officer must attend under the schedule then in operation. In addition to the two regular Post meetings held on the first and third Mondays of the ten months of the year, they were also required to attend the Post Affairs Committee meeting on the monthy second Monday and the Board of Directors meeting which takes place on the last Monday of each month. The Post meetings are fixed by the Post's Constitution and By-Laws. The other two meetings are at the discretion of the Chairman, who happens to be the Post Commander for the Post Affairs Committee and the Chairman of the Board of Directors, who according to the Constitution cannot be the Post Commander.

The move for the change was also made in the interest of increasing the attendance at Post meetings which continue to be from under-quorum (which is 20) to about ten over quorum. The discussion was begun by Al Woehrle at the mid-December meeting. Objection to any change of meeting date for the Board of Directors was expressed by Chairman Barkhuff and some others. As a result of the discussion, a motion by Vice Commander Gene Fitzpatrick was approved which changes the time of the Post Affairs Committee, which will now meet at 7:00 p.m. on the first Monday of the month prior to the regular first meeting of the month. The Post Affairs Committee is composed of the Commander, Vice Commanders, Adjutant, Finance Officer and committee chairmen whom the Commander invites to these meetings.
