

Another feature for this affair will be the raffling off of a ceramic eight-horse drawn wagon with a load of beer barrels. Truly, a conversation and decorative piece anyone would be delighted to own.

Dinner tickets are priced at \$2.25 for adults and \$1.25 for children. The souvenir steins are not included in the price for the dinner tickets.
