## **Commando Monument Near Ground Zero Unveiled on Vet's Day**

The first statue to be placed near ground zero in New York City, to salute the heroes of the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks, will not be a fireman or policeman but is a lone U.S. Commando on horseback in the Afghan mountains.

Entitled "De Opresso Liber" – "to free the oppressed," the Green Berets' motto, the statue is a tribute to the first organized US forces to strike back at Al Queda's stronghold in Afghanistan. Thirty-four U.S. commandos conducted raids, organized Afghan tribesmen to fight the insurgents and even participated in a cavalry charge.

The statue is 18 feet tall, weighs 3 tons and has a piece of the World Trade Center imbedded in its base. NAUS salutes those who inspired the statue and those who followed through and made sure the statue was completed.



### **Spend a Minute with a Member**

Ray Bender, former Naval Signalman is in his 43rd year as a member of the N.A. Blanchard Post of the American Legion. Born in Albany, New York Ray's dad was an Albany Firefighter. At 17, Ray joined the U.S. Navy. He attended Boot Camp in Sampson, New York near Buffalo and completed Armed Guard School in Norfolk, Virginia. As a qualified gunner he was one of 27 Navy men assigned to a Merchant Marine Vessel.

Ray's first mission was aboard one of 170 Liberty Ships that sailed from the U.S. to England in 1943 with supplies for the English and United States troops. Following that assignment he headed to the Invasion at Normandy but his orders were changed slightly and was specifically assigned to the taking of Omaha Beach was the responsibility of United States Army troops, with sea transport provided by the U.S. Navy and elements of the Royal Navy.

After that Ray qualified as a Signalman and a highly qualified one at that. He was able to read 14 words per minute by light which far exceeded the Navy's standard of 8 words per minute. As a Signalman, Ray headed to Pearl Harbor on an LST (Landing Ship Tank) and was then assigned to the Destroyer USS Adams headed to Okinawa. While at sea, Ray recalls being passed a dark pair of sunglasses one day with specific instructions to keep them on. As Ray looked up he saw a bright light - - - the bombing of Nagasaki, Japan. Ray was discharged April 26, 1946 wearing the American Theater Medal, the Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, the Victory Medal and the European African Middle Eastern Campaign Medal.

Upon his return Ray worked at Montgomery Ward and them for NBC, IBS and Millbrook Bakeries as a Route Manager, retiring in 1986. Ray and his late wife Elsie of 28 years, loved to dance. Ray recalls many Saturday nights at the Blanchard Post dancing to the Cordialeer's in the late 70's and early 80's. In his 43 years at the Blanchard Post, Ray has served as Secretary, Bell Jar Chairman and Part-time Bartender. He continues to enjoy bowling. Ray has three adult children; Richard, Diane and David.

Last month Ray travelled with 34 other Capital District Veterans to Washington, D.C. on the Patriot Flight. Ray was moved by the ceremonies and thank you's he and his comrades received while entering the Albany Airport and also when arriving in Baltimore as they were greeted by Cadets from the U.S. Naval Academy.
