On a quiet residential street in Delmar lies a building known to only a few. It's home to the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post of the American Legion. Nearly 800 members comprised of Legionaries, the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary and the Sons of the American Legion remain constantly busy serving and giving back to the community. From breakfast buffets, free dinners for vets, music concerts and rentals of their banquet hall, it's all done by volunteers.

While there is not an actually tally of the thousands of volunteer hours it takes to run these organizations and their programs, there certainly is a measure of their success. Even in a down economy the Blanchard Post has found ways to continue to raise funds which it returns to the community. In 2012 the Post raised the amazing sum of \$31,715.

In a recent interview, Legion Commander Steve Riedel, a Marine Veteran and Retired Navy Seebee explained that, "giving back to programs that support our veterans is incredibly rewarding. For years we have supported Freedom Flight which brings World War II veterans to the Memorial in Washington, DC. This year our donation to that one initiative exceeded \$6000. The tears, followed by smiles, takes your breath away as you listen to a WWII vet describe the trip." Vietnam era Veteran Phil Giacone who serves as the Chairman of the Board explains, "While we are here to support America's Veterans and current servicemen and women, we recognize that when we served, American's were there to support us. It's only appropriate that we return the favor and give back to the community. Most of our community-based giving is focused on children. They are our future."



Spend a Minute with a Member

Dodie Pennington knew what the U.S. Army was all about even before she enlisted. Her dad was a Warrant Officer during World War One and shipped off to France within a month after Dodie was born. He returned to their Bay Ridge, Brooklyn home within a year but remained on active duty. Dodie remembers living at Ft. Hamilton, Camp Dix and on Governor's Island. While on Governor's Island she recalled having to take a ferry into Manhattan every day to attend school in a two-room schoolhouse. That's didn't last long because the Commanding Colonel's wife had the Army build a two-room schoolhouse right on Governor's Island. Dodie and her family followed her dad to Panama where they also lived for a few years before moving to Atlanta, GA.

She finished high school in Atlanta and went on to study at the Atlanta Opportunity School where she learned typing and general office skills. They then moved to Manila, Philippines where Dodie went to work and remained after her family returned to the states in October 1940. However, in 1941 her father called for her to return to the U.S. as world tensions began to rise.



As World War Two began Dodie enlisted in the Women's Army Corps. After five weeks of basic training she was selected for Officer Candidate School in Fort Des Moines, Iowa. She received her commission as a Second Lieutenant and was assigned to the Air Service Command in Orlando, FL. The ASC was responsible for securing equipment and supplies and arranging for their transport to our troops overseas. Her ASC duty took her to New Guinea where she met Richard Pennington, a First Lieutenant in the Army Signal Corps. Dodie and Richard were married in the Philippines in 1946. When they returned to the states, Richard was discharged and went to New York City while Dodie was at Ft. Dix where she gave birth to their first child Richard on a night when she and her husband planned to sneak away to a movie. Richard was followed by Jennifer, Bruce and Cynthia.

Dodie was discharged as a Captain and went on to raise her children in Port Washington, Long Island. Once they grew up, the kids settled in upstate New York and Dodie and Richard moved to East Berne and then Delmar where they joined the Blanchard Post. Dodie said that from the minute Richard walked in the door he was welcomed with open arms. They both joined the Post and were active for many years. Richard passed away in 1988. Dodie remains a resident of Delmar and continues to enjoy all the friends she has met at the Blanchard Post. Next time you see Dodie thank her for securing all those supplies for our troops. Our freedom would not be what it is today if it were not for Dodie and others like her who made sure our fighting troops had what they needed to preserve our freedom.
