He was formerly a student at Vincentian Institute in Albany.

In announcing Blanchard's 1966 representative, Oratorical Chairman Russ Denegar had special praise for Bethlehem High School's English Supervisor, Robert C. Lambert, who encouraged a preliminary contest in the school. Ted Smith was the winner. In the run-off, Ted showed great promise to be a star in the County final which takes place Sunday, January 23 at St. Teresa of Avila Audi-

torium on New Scotland Ave., Albany. The time is 2:00 p.m.

A member of Bethlehem Central High School's Debate and Key Clubs, Ted looks forward to becoming a law student and entering the legal profession.

PLANS FOR BLOODMOBILE

Blood Bank Chairman Warren Moessner is proceeding with plans for the Bender Laboratory Bloodmobile to come to Blanchard Post on Wednesday, February 9. The time may be moved up an hour to 5:00 p.m. to accommodate the Bloodmobile personnel.

To help carry out the plans, Warren has formed a committee of at least 16 others to whom he has given each a list of 25 names of our members to solicit their availability to donate a pint of blood next month.

"This" says Chairman Moessner, "will give those who in the past complained about the inconvenience of going to a blood lab the opportunity they sought—to donate their blood."

He went on, "We certainly hope what was printed in last month's 1040 TIMES

about the Bloodmobile has been absorbed and that enough of our members are planning to donate their blood so that we will have a successful program."

Art Quinn reports that many persons at the bar have spoken about the coming Bloodmobile. But he hasn't yet been asked for a Blood-Bank card for donors to fill out. They are in the Commander's desk. Art Quinn is considered an exofficio member of the committee.

By January 17, Chairman Moessner wants to know how many and who have indicated a willingness to donate blood so that he can finalize the arrangements with the Bender Laboratory for bringing the Bloodmobile to Blanchard Post. "Will you please give him your help, asks Commander Costigan."

MEDICARE TALK

Of special interest to all war veterans, especially to World War I vets, is a talk scheduled for January 3, regular Post meeting. The talk will be by Blanchard Legionnaire Frederick Trombe who is a Field Representative from the Albany office of the Social Security Administration in the U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare. He will discuss the various aspects of medicare from the Federal Government's position.

For a subject of such vital interest to everyone, Commander Costigan wants it to be known that this meeting will be open to anyone who wishes to visit the Post to hear Fred's talk. The Commander says: "We are fortunate to have in our membership an individual closely associated with the Social Security program and the recently enacted medicare legislation. It is a privilege to extend this service to our friends and community neighbors and we look for a good size audience to hear Fred's remarks on this important subject.'

OPERATION SHOW YOUR COLORS

At the Albany County Legion meeting held in Blanchard Post on November 23 County Commander George Jiga, Jr., announced an American Legion sponsored program to distribute a metal miniature of the American Flag to be worn on the lapel or otherwise displayed. The program is called "Operation Show Your Colors". With the pin went a card stating "Americans are serving the cause of freedom in Viet Nam. I wear my country's Flag to show that I support their efforts." The flag-like pin and card are given away without cost.

The County officers issued about 2,000 buttons and cards to Blanchard Post to distribute. Commander Ed Costigan appointed John J. Brady as chairman for this activity. The following Saturday, Commander Costigan with Chairman Brady and Al Woehrle were at the Elsmere Shopping Plaza handing out the pins and the cards. Past Blanchard Post Commander and now Town of Bethlehem Supervisor Bert Kohinke appeared on the scene and a picture of him receiving the flag and card from Costigan and Brady was made and it appeared in the SPOT-LIGHT. It showed this particular American Legion program in action.

An observation by the Blanchard Legionnaires distributing these flags and cards was the unexpected high number of persons who refused to accept them. A discussion among themselves gave this trio the conclusion that there is a need to awaken patriotism. Some persons offered a donation for the pins—and their offers had to be declined. Perhaps some of those who refused the flags thought it was a pitch for solicitations-and hurried away before getting an explanation. Perhaps the American Legion at all levels should have prepared more abundant advance publicity about the program.

What is more significant than the refusals of accepting these flags and cards is the fact that Blanchard Post has distributed the 2,000 buttons, yet very few persons can be found wearing them. This certainly points up the need for patriotism to be awakened. Do your part to awaken it!
