BLANCHARD OKAYS KOREAN BONUS

At the mid-December meeting of the Post an affirmative vote was taken on a motion to petition Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller and the New York State Legislature to take steps which would enable the issuance of a State bonus for Korean War veterans

The approval action was taken after Albany County Legion Korean Bonus Chairman Steve Maney explained the Legion's position on the bonus and the action required by Legion members and proponents of the bonus. A petition was circulated among those attending the meeting and their signatures will be forwarded to the County Legion which is gathering all the signatures for presentation to the Governor and the Legislative leaders.

For those not present at the meeting who wish to express their sentiments in favor of a Korean War bonus, your Post Korean Bonus Chairman, Ken Lenseth, suggests that you use this copy of your 1040 TIMES by signing your name to it, and mailing it to Kenny at the Post. Your sentiments will be forwarded along with the signed petition. Also, for your convenience on the Post bulletin board there is a copy of the petition which you and anyone who is for the bonus, may sign.

The petition, recommended by the County Legion and the Department, received an amendment at the recommendation of Wayne Davis who urged bonus consideration be given the dependents of GIs who gave their lives in the Korean military action.

We look to being successful at the "kick-off" contest after which will come the District and then the Zone contests in March. Harold Barkhuff, chairman of the Legion's Zone Contests expects to have arrangements completed to bring that event to Delmar in the BCHS auditorium.
