## U.S. Naval Sea Cadets Recruiting Youths in Capital District

Lt. Comdr. De Salvo, Lt. Everhardt and a contingent of U.S. Naval Sea Cadets will give a talk and slide show immediately following the regular Post meeting on October 15. The special program will start at 8:30. Interested parents and sons are invited to attend.

Lt. Comdr. De Salvo stated "Cadet Membership" is voluntary. It does not obligate the young man, in any manner, to serve in the armed forces. The main objective is to teach young men good citizenship, a knowledge of sea lore and give them a sense of responsibility and direction.

Lt. Everhardt, a retired state trooper and presently the sergeant-at-arms in our State Senate said, "I think working with these boys is about the finest thing anyone can do. Both the Navy and the Navy League try to provide the Cadets with an educational base and practical training as broad as possible so as to develop the whole man training concept.

Lt. J. C. Rapp, Sea Cadet Officer, instructor, is responsible for the Albany-Delmar area, stated, "except for minor administration fees borne by the cadets themselves, the cost is defrayed by the Navy League." The division schedules

three weekend visits each year for all cadets to various Naval activities and/or ships. Applications for enrollment in the Albany Division will be received any Thursday night between 7:30 and 9:30 at the Naval Reserve Training Center, 780 Washington Avenue, Albany, N. Y.

Naval Sea Cadet Jim Erlichman (SA), age 16, of Slingerlands said "This July I spent two weeks taking abbreviated Navy basic training at the U.S. Naval Air Station at Willow Grove, Pa. We had regular U.S. Marine DIs, took helicopter trips, had survival training—both sea and land, firearms instruction, and the use at the station range as well as seamanship instruction."

"Last February I attended a three-day course at the U.S. Naval fire fighting and water damage control school near Philadelphia. We learned how to attack and corner a fire within a building and staged fires on grounded aircraft. We also tried to save the USS Buttercup under simulated attack—but I can tell you about that on October 15."
