TO THE COLORS

If we are to believe all of the news reports these days, then things are getting stranger and stranger. One of the latest gems to come to the notice of your correspondent has to do with the current campaign to grant amnesty to a breed of scoff-laws masquerading as martyrs. The subject report quoted one of President Ford's sons as saying that the matter of amnesty was one of the first things he had made it a point to discuss with his father after he had been sworn in as President. The son was further quoted as saying that his father reacted favorably, or words to that effect, to the suggestion that some form of amnesty was in order for deserters and draft-dodgers. This response evidently surprised even the son, along with the majority of the American people. If this interview was correctly reported the nation may be in for a period of "reconstruction" where policy determination could reach ridiculous stages, such as maybe even "let's discuss it with Jane Fonda." One of the tragedies of our times is that the American people have been and are being manipulated by individuals and groups preaching "salvation" but obviously bent upon destruction, wittingly or otherwise.

Another example of the type of mentality in our midst seeking "vindication" is that preaching the exoneration of convicted traitors of the like of the Rosenbergs and Alger Hess. Here, too, the theme is that they were the victims of a fiendish plot hatched by Communist haters in this country. To seek to clothe these traitors, and the pathetic specimens who deserted the service or suddenly conjured up a conscience, in a cloak of innocence, is to mouth the Fascist-Communist line. And to refer to any action as "revenge" is to do a disservice to anyone who has ever served his country and to the American people at large.

Let us trust that the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars continue to adhere to the principles they have so often expressed on these matters.
