## MEMORIAL PARK REDEDICATION

Special Veterans Day ceremonies will take place on Sunday, November 11th, when an official rededication program takes place at the Bethlehem Memorial Park on Delaware near Oakwood Ave.

Through the benevolence of Arthur M. Main of Slingerlands, N. Y., the park grounds, which has been on a "loan status" to the Bethlehem Service Men's Committee for the past two decades, will be deeded to the Town of Bethlehem for the sole purpose of serving as a memorial to those of our community who sacrificed their lives in the defense of the United States of America.

Blanchard Legionnaire Otto deHeus is the sole surviving member of the three-man committee which has been in charge of the Memorial Park since it was first established on November 11, 1942. The other members were Dr. Thomas M. Holmes and John M. Oliver. All were World War I vets. Initially, the memorial commemorated the 1,700 Bethlehem residents who served the Armed Forces.

The purpose of the rededication is to formally transfer the title of the property to the Town of Bethlehem. In the event the Park ceases to be used as a Memorial

in the future there is a proviso that it will revert to the estate of Mr. Main.

In addition to the legal transfer of the property, plans are underway to make the Park even more attractive than it is.

The dedication and improvement plans are a joint venture in which Blanchard Post and the Bethlehem Memorial Post No. 3185 V.F.W. are sharing. The VFW Commander is Ralph Sherman.

Under the chairmanship of Commander Rodger Fryer our Post has a Committee on which the following are serving: Harold Barkhuff and George Butman, program; Ken Jopp and Ed Costigan, publicity; Bill Flint and Bob Mulligan, coordinators.

County Legion Commander Stephen Maney and other veteran and civic organization leaders are being invited.

Auxiliary President Mary Conner is cooperating with Commander Fryer in urging a strong attendance of Legion and Auxiliary members at the Rededication ceremony which takes place at two o'clock in the afternoon. Both Legionnaires and Auxiliary members are expected to wear their Legion caps at the Rededication. (If you don't have a cap, this is a good reminder to get one).
