Hospitalization in VA Hospitals

Veterans of wartime service, post-Korean conflict and Vietnam era service who have *no* service-connected disabilities are eligible for VA Hospitalization providing the following conditions are met:

- 1. Hospitalization is necessary.
- 2. The veteran certifies his inability to pay private hospital costs elsewhere.
 - 3. A bed is available.

In emergency situations it is preferable to have a doctor call the admitting physician or at night the medical OD to explain the medical aspects of the case. If a doctor is not in attendance then the next of kin or close friend should call the VAH. If the use of a private ambulance is required, approval of the cost of same must be obtained from the VAH at the time the original call is made. Approval cannot be obtained at a later date. The admitting physician or night OD must approve verbally and make the necessary notation in his records. The above are a few of the constant problems involved in veterans service. We ask that you make note of them.

Nursing Home Care Expenses Deductible for Pension Purposes

Recently, a case was submitted for administration review on the question of whether the cost of nursing home re could be deducted from Social Security disability insurance payments in computing income for pension purposes. The veteran is a patient in a private nursing home and is in receipt of Social Security disability payments for the disabilities which require nursing home care. It was held by VA Central Office that the amounts paid for such care could be deductible from Social Security payments under VA Regulation 1262 (I).

JUST LIKE THAT

A GIANT mirror, which would warm the earth and keep some cities in perpetual daylight, can be built in space by 1970, insists Dr. Hermann Oberth, famed German scientist, who first advanced his revolutionary idea thirty years ago. "The grand old man of German rocketry" predicts that the mirror, which would measure some 300 miles in diameter and orbit around the globe at an altitude of many hundreds of miles, could also be used to melt Arctic and Antarctic ice and snow, and control much of the earth's weather.

The mirror could be built piece by piece in

orbit, possibly from materials mined from the moon, as this would be much more economical and practical than rocketing the necessary materials from the earth.

The space mirror would be equipped with a crew whose function it would be to focus it in such a way as to melt polar ice and to warm other cold areas. Equalization of temperatures, Dr. Oberth says, would abolish the Sahara and other unproductive areas of the earth's surface, and turn them into garden spots, thus alleviating many of the world's economic and population problems.
