Veteran's Day 1991



At 11 a.m., November 11, 1918, the guns of World War I were stilled. For the first time in our nation's history, Americans on European soil had defended the cause of freedom. Since that day, other generations of Americans have answered their country's call to defend the national purpose and the cause of individual dignity.

November 11, 1991 is Veteran's Day, a time to honor all of our veterans, men and women who have fulfilled the highest obligation of their citizenship.

Out of World War I, which ended 73 years ago, was born the American Legion. An organization of wartime veterans dedicated to God and Country, the Legion now includes in its ranks over 3 millions veterans of World War I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, Grenada, Lebanon, Panama and the Gulf. In their quest "to make right the master of right," American Legionnaires devote their endeavors to a strong, vigorous, compassionate America to lead the way to world peace with honor.

On this Veteran's Day 1991, we join with all America in a salute to the veterans of our nation and our community.

American Education Week

The American Legion, for the 71st year, will play a leading role in the annual observance of American Education Week, November 25th through 30th. Blanchard Post, as always, will do its part in the observance of this week locally. This year we will contribute to a fund for a school project which will enhance the program of citizenship education of the 4th and 5th graders on the U.S. Constitution.

Veteran's Day Parade

Post members are invited to come out and march with our Color Guard in the annual Veteran's Day Parade in Albany. Uniforms, while desired, are not mandatory. The parade route will be somewhat different than in past years. Details of the new route will be posted in the Lounge when we receive them.

Desert Storm Veterans

Evidence of significant readjustment problems faced by returning Gulf War veterans and their family members has caught the attention of Congress. Reports of increased marital problems, divorces, child abuse, spouse abuse, drug abuse and alcohol abuse among returning veterans and their family members has prompted the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee to hold hearings concerning readjustment problems. Just over half of the soldiers deployed to the Persian Gulf were married and/or had dependents, nearly triple the number in the Vietnam War, and very different from previous wars.

Also, a preliminary report prepared by the Department of Veterans Affairs revealed that nearly 10% of the first 2,500 deactivated and discharged Operation Desert Storm veterans seen at VA facilities were treated for psychiatric problems. The American Legion has seen first-hand evidence of this and has appeared before Congress on this matter.

December 7th, 1991

On Saturday, December 7th, our Post will mark the 50th Anniversary of the treacherous bombing of Pearl Harbor by the Japanese. A short memorial service will include the Post Color Guard and a salute by the firing squad. The service will be held at the Flag pole in front of the Post at a time to be announced in our December issue of the 1040 Times and in the local papers.




